

## When a tree application may be approved:

Consent may be granted for:

- i. removal of unsuitable or hazardous trees
- ii. thinning of crowns to preserve solar access, some selective pruning and reduction of the weight of limbs
- iii. maintenance pruning to remove dead, diseased, dying and defective branches
- iv. selective pruning to remove branches causing conflict through encroachment on own or neighbouring buildings
- v. root pruning of trees to ameliorate damage to built and natural structures in such a manner as to not compromise the health of trees
- vi. pruning for service lines
- vii. lifting of crowns to allow pedestrian or vehicular access
- viii. pruning for vehicle sight lines, signage and RMS requirements
- ix. removal of trees in conflict with built structures, where all engineering alternatives have been considered
- x. construction/extension of buildings where there is no alternative to maintain the tree/s
- xi. minimum work to ensure trees remain safe
- xii. pruning and removal of fruit trees and flowering fruit trees not located on a heritage listed property or the *Register of Significant Trees*, depending on the species in question
