

BRONTE BEACH PRECINCT

Minutes of the Bronte Beach Precinct on Wednesday June 20th.2018.

The meeting at Lugar Brae Church Hall, Bronte, at 7.30 pm was opened by Chair Andrew Goffe

Apologies: **Present: 15**

Minutes of the previous meeting: Proposed by Michael Hudson, Seconder Ute Geissler
Passed unanimously.

Special Guest, Beth Kasumovic from Council's Waste Services gave a short presentation on the recycling area of Council's activities .She advised the meeting that the reason for Australian recyclables being rejected by China is the contamination problem –too many recyclables are being disposed of with other materials eg paper with plastic, foodboxes still with food on them etc. The Container Deposit Scheme is proceeding with 10c.per container being paid from depots. The following containers are accepted –beer NOT wine and containers have to be uncrushed and not broken. A reverse Vending Machine is being trialled at Bronte Beach for the next three months.

She further advised that black plastic is not recovered as it can't be identified on the MRF and therefore is not recycled.

Development Applications The meeting was advised by Virginia Milson that objections for 1 Marroo St, 3 Chesterfield Pde and 34/36 MacPherson St. had been lodged with Council.

Bronte RSL Steve Lightfoot of Save Bronte advised the meeting on the results of the L&E Crt hearing. The developer has agreed that all trucks will proceed in a forward direction in Chesterfield Lane, the restaurants are to be Three in number and have 50 seats each.

St.Catherine's School - Cathy Davitt reported that the School has now received its Construction Certificate and commencement of building is planned for the end of August. It has been stipulated that for Events Nights the School has to use the underground carpark which holds 75/76 cars and before a major event residents have to be given a minimum of two weeks notice.
