“ A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

We are one year through this new term and what a productive year it's been. Council is moving ahead with projects to improve the quality of life of residents and the success of business in Waverley.

Council is committed to cleaning up our streets faster. We are hiring new staff and are moving to a standard of removing dumped rubbish off footpaths and streets within two business days of residents reporting the dumping. We will continue with waste education and minimisation programs and enforcement alongside this improved clean up response time.

One of the highlights of the year has been our roll out of changes to parking fees and permits. The changes ensured residents are the first priority when it comes to parking in Waverley. In the largest consultation ever undertaken by Council, the community told us they wanted greater flexibility around parking and this is what we have delivered. The first residential parking permit is now free and we have switched off Bondi Junction parking meters after 6pm. Proposed changes to the Beach Parking permit were not well supported in the community and have not been implemented. A second review of parking in Queen Elizabeth Drive and Park Drive will now be undertaken.

The provision of extra toilet and shower amenities at Bondi Beach is long overdue. Council has just started preparing plans for a new amenities block with various options being considered with direct access off the beach and off the concourse.

We have budgeted for a new major childcare facility and are currently conducting a feasibility study, and have introduced new guidelines to ensure Council owned surf club buildings are maintained into the future.

A new architect's brief has been approved for the refurbishment of the Bondi Pavilion after a series of meetings with the community, particularly the Bondi Pavilion Stakeholder Committee - a fully consultative process with agreement of the key aspects of the brief to the architects. This marks a line in the sand with the new brief ensuring the Pavilion is restored as a community and cultural centre.

Dockless bikes came and we hoped they would be successful, but the reality was they were poorly managed by the operators and became a major problem. Waverley Council, and other councils in Sydney and Melbourne, cleaned up the mess. We started with an open mind but ended having to enforce the law.

Council continues to lobby the State Government to provide direct access off Oxford St through Rowe

St into the Bus Rail Interchange for commuters. We are now considering constructing access ourselves on behalf of the community. This is a long term and complex project which needs cooperation from the State Government and your Council is determined to pursue this vital improvement to public transport.

The most significant legislative matter we are dealing with relates to new laws for development approval. New State Government imposed laws have resulted in Councillors no longer having a say in individual development approvals. This means developments that Council and the community don't support can gain approval by the developer going directly to the State Government. We are actively lobbying to re-establish the right of the community to have a say on development approvals.

All Council meetings are now full video live streamed and archived on the internet at our waverley.nsw.gov.au website as part of our commitment to open public democracy.

FESTIVAL OF THE WINDS IS TURNING 40!

Who would have known back in 1978, when a group of wind energy champions decided to run a kite festival on Bondi Beach, that the Festival of the Winds would be born and end up as one of the biggest and most loved kite flying festivals in the world!

At that time, Glebe local and Sydney University student, John Silk's interest in wind energy led to his fascination and love of kite making and flying. John, along with several of his friends, decided that it would be great to run a kite festival and decided that Spring at Bondi Beach was the best time and place to launch their idea.

On 10 September 1978, 40 years ago, the first Festival of the Winds took off! The Mayor of Waverley at the time, Mr Ernie Page, officially opened the newly named Festival of the Winds, declaring the skies open, and joined the crowd to fly a kite.

John Silk, his kite-flying friends and enthusiasts on that day, formed the Australian Kiteflying Society (AKS) who have presented the professional kite flying exhibitions with national and international kite talent each year ever since.


Bondi Pavilion cultural staff joined in by organising entertainment, food stalls, kite making workshops, gallery exhibitions, workshops and all the festival fun that ran alongside, and still runs alongside, the professional kite flying displays on the beach.

From 7000 people in 1978 to an expected 40,000 people for its 40th anniversary, Festival of the Winds continues to provide a great day out for everyone. This event is perfect for people of all ages who want to celebrate the joy of kite flying, kite making, our environment and enjoy the best cultural food and entertainment from around the world!

Bring along your own kite or make a sky-high creation at one of the kite making workshops. There will be demonstrations, and a day-long entertainment program on the main stage.

What's happening with the upgrade of the Bondi Pavilion?

At the June Council meeting, Council voted to approve the revised architect's brief. It was developed following extensive community and stakeholder consultation incorporating the recommendations of the Bondi Pavilion Stakeholder Committee. This follows the earlier, February Council meeting, decision to formally withdraw the Development Application for the Stage 1 upgrade, which was submitted in March 2017.

The architects, Tonkin Zulaikha Greer, will now work on a new concept design for the whole building.

This design will then be part of another public consultation period before the DA process and detailed design commences. We are expecting this consultation period to begin soon, so please check our website for details.

Outside of the Pavilion project, there is a lot happening with maintenance and smaller-scale renovations at the Pavilion. For instance:

- Work has recently finished on a complete re-roofing of the High Tide room
- New turf has been laid, and additional work done on courtyard lawns

- Planter boxes in the courtyards have been freshly planted
- The large planter box inside the atrium has been removed and the floor tiled.

Waverley Cemetery Coastal Walk reopens


In June 2016, Waverley Cemetery's coastal walk was damaged in a wild storm. Repairs have been made and it is due to reopen in late September.

This complex work has reinforced the structural integrity of the coastal walk and has secured the landslip from further slippage and erosion.

It has stabilised the existing embankment, providing long term engineered reinforcement to protect the embankment, with extensive fortification to withstand forecasted storm events.

We have optimised storm water cleansing and passive irrigation with a new stormwater retention system through a hanging swamp and rainwater garden.

We have also created a habitat for local providence species with more than 3,500 plants and have created reflective spaces with amazing views.



We'd like to thank the community for their patience while this extensive work was carried out.

Fairer parking for all

We're adopting a fairer approach to parking in Waverley with changes to parking fees and permits.

Council received hundreds of responses over our *Waverley Community Parking Proposal* and as of 1 July 2018, Council decided to implement the changes that received the strongest overall support. They include:

- The fee for the first residential parking permit has been removed (for residents at properties with no car space)



- Some parking meters in the Bondi Junction commercial area are switched off at 6pm each day
- In nearby streets, where residential parking schemes apply, parking meters will remain on. This will encourage people to park in free areas and away from residential streets
- A total of 25 '15 minute drop-in' zones will be introduced in Bondi Junction and Bondi Beach.

Please note, some exemptions on time restrictions can apply to parking areas. As such, motorists are encouraged to always check traffic signage.

We know these changes will have a positive impact on how people go about their day-to-day lives in Waverley.

New art in Waverley!

Public art enlivens our streets. It adds meaning to our cities and creates uniqueness for our communities; it reflects who we are, our heritage, history and aspirations for the future. We have recently launched two new public works:

Interplay at Waverley Mall

June saw the launch of artist Jade Oakley's beautiful sculptural intervention, *Interplay*, in Waverley Mall. The artist explained that the work seeks to inspire a contemplation on nature. It speaks of the sense of place that comes from time spent with trees. This lighting and sculptural work that transforms from day to night, both celebrating and protecting the trees in Waverley Mall by acting as a metaphorical tree guard.

pH in Gould and Roscoe Street Plaza

March saw the launch of pH (People Here), a public sculpture by artist Graham Chalcraft. This installation uses vibrant colours to reflect the colour code spectrum of pH litmus test markers. It connects with Waverley's diverse community through the universal language of colour.

pH is Graham's second public artwork in the Waverley area – his first, *Park Life* celebrates the history of Waverley Park and can be seen in the Margaret Whitlam Recreation Centre.



WAVERLEY COMMUNITY STRATEGIC PLAN 2018-29



On 19 June 2018, we adopted our new Waverley Community Strategic Plan 2018-29. This plan outlines the community's vision – your vision for us - and our priorities over the next 11 years.



Commemorating life since 1877

State heritage listed, Waverley and South Head Cemeteries are two of Sydney's oldest continually operating cemeteries, caring for families since 1877.
