		SYDNEY WATER – UPDATE ON TREATMENT FACILITY UPGRADE PROJECT
	1.	The project will take between 8 & ten years. Sydney Water pamphlets, titled “Bondi Water Resource Recovery Facility (Community update – December 2021)”, have been distributed to members. The project will look at the plant holistically to determine future requirements. Next year the plant will be 70 years old. The social impact will be assessed. Part of the project will be to speak to the Community & this is why they gave a presentation to the Combined Council. Cost is estimated at \$30m Will provide the Chairman with the survey details, so it can be sent to members. It can also be accessed via their Website. They will be forming a Community Committee to liaise in relation to same.
7.2.		TRAFFIC COMMITTEE (Cr Tony Kay) Tony has been involved with the Committee since 2004, & has been Chairman & is currently Deputy Chairman. The Traffic Committee comprises the Mayor (Chairman), Transport for NSW, Police, Delegate of the two State Members of Parliament. The MP’s delegate only vote on matters affecting their area (problems can cover both areas & then they both vote). Whatever vote goes to Council, who can ratify, reject or modify. Generally it is a closed meeting, however, you can ask to speak (subject to certain rules). All decisions are confidential, until placed on the Council agenda for their full meeting. Bike trackways are referred to the Committee. Traffic lights & main roads are not. It is a technical committee & does not think of the community too much.



It speeds up repairs enormously whether it is reporting Traffic Signs that have been knocked down, Street lights not working or staying on all day to getting the road surface fixed.

One item I would like to raise is the intersection of Glenayr and O'Donnell streets. There is a yield/ give-way sign that is obstructed by a large bush. Cars often race around the corner without slowing endangering pedestrians crossing the road.
