	'During the two weeks of Sculptures, my observation was that the traffic on Dellview and Gaerloch streets was chaotic and dangerous. Cars often went down these temporary one-way streets the wrong way and were parked the wrong way, for the whole two weeks. If you travel a one-way street, you don't expect to meet a car coming the other way. The questions to be asked of Council/police	Traffic flow enforcement and infringement within a one-way system is a matter for Police, not for Council officers. Council parking officers can, however, issue infringements for vehicles that are parked the wrong way. 7 fines were issued in these streets during SBTS for a variety of reasons. Police have not release information for how many infringements they issued. Please note, because a car parking the wrong way isn't evidence that the car traveled the wrong way. Especially on a street with the physical characteristics of Gaerloch Ave, where residents habitually park facing the way they do, where there is room to turn around and people follow others.
