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		For complying development, applicants need to comply with the conditions set out in the Codes State Environmental Planning Policies (SEPPs). These conditions set out the applicant's obligations once a complying development certificate has been issued. If the Conditions of Consent or complying development certificate are not complied with, the Certifying Authority may take enforcement action such as issuing a notice/order /written direction to have the applicant rectify the issue. Furthermore, Council's Compliance Officers may investigate complaints about unauthorised building works including erosion and sediment control and illegal dumping of waste. If a resident is concerned about a site, they should send either a Snap Send Solve to Council or call Customer Service Centre to report this issue. Council's Compliance Officers will investigate accordingly. With respect to the laneway between Francis Street and Forest Knoll Avenue, the Executive Manager of Compliance has advised that Council has responded to community concerns and undertaken the development of the Hoarding and Scaffolding Guidelines ('The Guidelines') that will provide practical controls for the design, approval, maintenance and regulation of temporary structures within the Waverley LGA. This will also ensure that the temporary structures are appropriately designed so as to minimise adverse impacts on pedestrian amenity, public safety, vehicle and bicycle movement. Moved: Rex W Second: Mark G Carried	Council operates a <u>clean-up collection</u> for bulky household waste that allows residents to have up to three pick-ups per calendar year, so there is no reason for materials to be dumped on public land. Illegal dumping can incur an on the spot fine of \$4,000 for individuals and \$8,000 for corporations in addition to liability under the <u>NSW Protection of the Environment Operations Act</u> . Fines are even greater if <u>issued by the EPA</u> . Surveillance cameras are used in Waverley Council to deter and respond to incidences of illegal dumping. We ask residents to report illegal dumping by notifying Council of any items illegally dumped on public land through the <u>Snap Send Solve</u> app, via our <u>website form</u> or by calling <u>Customer Service</u> as soon as possible. This will assist Council with our investigations and enforcement. 		The number of streets selected is also influenced by the limited capacity for processing FOGO material in our region.			
		Regarding soft plastics, soft plastic recycling opportunities are currently limited across Australia, as demonstrated by the recent REDcycle collapse. This is due to the fact that post-consumer soft plastic packaging is difficult to recycle and the market demand for recycled soft plastic is low. As technology progresses and market demand increases, recycling facilities will have more capacity to accept soft plastic waste from Councils.			
		Waverley Council continues to monitor the progress of the soft plastic recycling industry and investigate the feasible and viable opportunities to facilitate soft plastic recycling for our residents. Work is underway by the City of Sydney to find a suitable soft plastic recycling partner for the Recycle it Saturday events, of which Waverley Council participates in and our residents can attend.
