Message from the Mayor

As I reflect on my first six months as Mayor, I am proud of the positive and transformative changes being delivered across Waverley. My team and I have been working hard to ensure our community thrives and remains the best place to live, work and visit. I am excited to share some of our key achievements so far.

One of our most ambitious undertakings is the reimagining of Bondi Junction through a Master Plan process – the first in 20 years. This vision will bring transformative change, including the development of a vibrant civic and cultural precinct alongside an exciting entertainment district. We have also initiated the process to transform the old Council Chambers into a dynamic community multipurpose space, ensuring that our residents have better access to recreational facilities.

Delivering on key infrastructure projects remains a priority. We have advanced the much-needed upgrade of Bronte Surf Life Saving Club and Community Facilities Building – a project that has been long overdue. With strong community consultation and Council's



endorsement, this essential upgrade will now proceed, strengthening the role our surf clubs play in keeping us safe on our beaches. We have also fast-tracked improvements to Rose Bay North Shops and the North Bondi Bus Terminus, enhancing accessibility and amenity in these key locations.

I am also very proud that Waverley has taken a leadership role in fostering social cohesion, co-leading a Mayoral Roundtable and becoming the first Council to adopt a Local Government Antisemitism Policy. I thank my fellow Mayors across Sydney for their involvement and leadership so that our communities can remain inclusive and connected. As ever, our commitment to community events and festivals has never been stronger. We have increased events and activations, particularly at Bondi Beach, making full use of the Pavilion as a cultural hub – and there is much more to come.

It is an honour to serve as your Mayor, and I look forward to working together to make Waverley an even better place to live.

Art & literary prizes in 2025

Each year, Waverley Council proudly offers two prestigious national awards. The Mark & Evette Moran Nib Literary Award acknowledges the best in researchbased literature, while the Waverley Art Prize celebrates excellence in Australian painting and drawing. Both prizes are currently open for submissions.



The Mark & Evette Moran Nib Literary Award

With a major prize of \$40,000, the Mark & Evette Moran Nib Literary Award is Waverley Council's annual celebration of the best in Australian research-based literature.

Books are judged by a panel of three expert judges using the criteria of literary merit, quality research, readability and value to the community.

Previous winners of the Award include celebrated historian Claire Wright, biologist Tim Low, journalist Gideon Haigh, and novelists Delia Falconer and Melissa Lucashenko.

Waverley Art Prize

The Waverley Art Prize has been running since 1986 as a painting and drawing prize. The Prize is aimed at emerging to professional artists, with the work of finalists exhibited at Bondi Pavilion Art Gallery and an Open Prize of \$15,000.

The Judges for 2025 are Anne Ryan, Curator Australian Art, AGNSW, and Jasper Knight, artist.

The funds raised through the art prize support Waverley Woollahra Art School and help them sustain their role as the longest running artist run initiative in Waverley.

What's happening in the Lawson Ward



Waverley Cemetery Shelter Rehabilitation

Work at Waverley Cemetery has been ongoing to restore the contemplation shelters. The seven contemplation shelters were in varying states of disrepair due to their age, construction material, and exposure to coastal elements. They required urgent remediation and/or restoration to provide a safe, peaceful space for reflection.

Five shelters have been open to the public since last December, and work is underway on the remaining two shelters.

Charing Cross Streetscape Upgrade

The Charing Cross Streetscape Upgrade Civil Works kicked off earlier this year and will continue throughout 2025.

Early site establishment works have been completed at Bronte Road and Macpherson Park work sites. Preliminary electrical works have been ongoing since mid-2024 and are expected to be completed by mid-May 2025.

Upcoming works include widening footpaths, repaving, tree-planting and street furniture installation.

Marks Park Coastal Walk Remediation

In April 2024, extreme coastal weather and natural erosion caused a cliff to collapse below Marks Park on the Bondi coastal walk, taking part of the walkway with it.

Geotechnical engineers have inspected the site and determined that the walkway cannot be reopened until cliff stabilisation works are completed and it is repaired.

Council have engaged specialist contractors to undertake this work, starting soon, weather permitting. We expect the walkway to reopen in the second half of 2025.

Thank you for your patience as we complete this complicated work. We look forward to welcoming everyone back to this beautiful part of our coastline soon.

Miller Street Upgrade

Progress is underway for the Miller Street Upgrade project which is now in the detailed design stage after our stage two community consultation in 2024.

Barracluff Park Improvements

Waverley Council is improving Barracluff Sportsfield to enhance the playing surface and create better sporting facilities for our community.

The upgrade includes enhanced drainage, irrigation and turf quality. This work is essential for maintaining a safe community sporting facility that serves our local sporting clubs and recreational users.

Road Infrastructure Renewal

We are excited to announce that as part of our yearly Road Infrastructure Renewal program, we are reconstructing and refurbishing the footpaths, kerbs, and gutters in Young Street and Mitchell Street in Hunter Ward, along with several other streets across our local government area (LGA).

This program draws from the Waverley's People, Movement and Places transport vision to improve local streetscapes, making it safer and more enjoyable to move around Waverley. The upgrades will not only enhance the aesthetics of the area but also provide better walkability and accessibility for all residents.

We appreciate the community's patience and understanding while these works are in progress.

What's happening in the Bondi Ward



Curlewis Street Streetscape Upgrade

Curlewis Street is an important community landmark marking the entrance to Bondi Beach and the Waverley area. The upgrade works make the area safer for all road users, promote active transport, and create a more inviting and vibrant space for the community to enjoy.

Stage 1 of the project is complete and includes improved footpaths, new trees, plantings, and landscaped areas. It also features an upgraded outdoor dining environment, improved pedestrian crossings, new multifunction light poles, and approximately 400m of a new twoway separated bike path. Stage 2 is underway to implement bike path transitions and improvements at the Campbell Parade intersection, and it will be operational shortly.

Further updates will be provided regarding upcoming stages. We would like to extend our appreciation to the community while works have been in progress.

Bondi Park Electrical and Lighting Upgrade

Council has been working on Stage 2 improvements to the lighting, footpaths, access, and parking along Park Drive at Bondi Beach. The final stage of works involves substation power upgrades, which will continue throughout April and May. This new energy supply connection will ensure that our electrical and lighting systems meet both current needs and future demands.

We're making strides towards a waste-free Waverley

We're making it easier for residents to reduce waste and recycle food waste to get us closer to our target of increasing waste recovery by 80%.

Don't know if you can recycle your sunscreen bottle? Curious what to do with your old table now that you have a new one? Use Recycle Mate! Simply go to the A-Z recycling page on our website and use the new tool bar and map to find out how to dispose of your waste correctly.

Food waste education series

To help you help the environment and save money, we have been hosting workshops focusing on fun ways to reduce your food waste. So far, residents have learnt about zero-waste cooking, taken a deep dive into fermentation, learnt food preservation methods and will even try making beeswax cling wraps from scratch next month.



FOGO Trial

By 2030, the NSW Government will require every household in NSW to dispose of Food and garden Organics (FOGO) via a dedicated FOGO service.

Six months ago, Waverley commenced a FOGO service trial with 2000 residents, providing each household with a kitchen caddy, compostable liners, and instruction guides to get started.

So far, the Waverley community has sent 100 tonnes of organic material to be composted, turned into fertiliser and reused to help green areas grow instead!

Thank you to our wonderful trial residents who have been FOGO'ing like pros. Your insightful feedback is helping us to improve the service, ready for rollout across the LGA more widely.
