5. Reports

a. Traffic: concern re. buses using Belgrave Street

Preamble: Bronte Precinct seeks advice from Waverley Council regarding Telford Buses and to lesser extent Scots College buses turning out of Murray Street into Belgrave Street and travelling to Dickson Street into Birrell St. to cut out the Murray-Birrell St. Roundabout. This is occurring 2 to 3 times a week particularly when conveying children from local primary schools to either sport or excursions.

- Why Telford and Scots College buses are using Belgrave St.
- Whether buses are permitted to use this route
- Whether it is safe for buses to use this route.

6. General Business

6a-Brian Ellison Liaison Officer Bronte Beach Community Centre Group, expressed concern in the Bronte Plan of management in relation to the wiping out of the 5 swimming clubs at the southern end of Bronte Beach. He presented a booklet explaining the different experiences provided by these clubs.

6b-Foxes—for over 5 years Residents in Thompson St. Have advised Council of foxes living in the lantana bushes on council land along Tamarama marine drive to the north of Thompson st. The Council has taken some actions over this time but has not solved the problem.

The foxes are a pest. They enter residents' property to dig holes, often undermining garden walls, and have even entered people's houses.

They are also killing native fauna in the area.

Foxes have been officially declared a pest in NSW.

Motion:

Bronte Precinct request Waverley Council to take much stronger action to eradicate the foxes on council property along Tamarama Marine Drive.

Proposed: Grant Beard-- Seconded Alma Douglas

6c.Rental Bikes are causing a problem in the area, what is Council's control over this problematic situation.
