Our park furniture is re-oiled once a year. For newly completed projects we increase this frequency to between 3 and 6 months for the first 12 months depending on how well the timbers are adjusting to the external environment.</p> <p>It can appear a bit patchy at first as the timbers continue to further dry out once exposed to outdoor conditions. This appearance will settle and be a more consistent finish over time, however the colour will start to change to a more natural grey.
