- 4. Removes Cr Fabiano as deputy chair of the Strategic Planning and Development Committee.



## 3 - Cliff Walks at Diamond Bay

Diamond Bay Cliff Walk is meant to be completed in Feb / March of 2024. Note the viewing platform has moved entirely and is now just below the pool of the high-rise above.

Dov spoke today with one of the people working on the project. While discussing our issues with materials being used, Dov was informed that they are polishing the steel on site and have been instructed to use 40 to 60 grit polish as anything higher takes too much time. You may recall we were promised in writing by council that the 316 stainless steel would be 600 grit polish which is less likely to rust and tea stain.

**MOTION 1 -** DHP requests that council demand that the contractor polish all stainless steel to 600 grit as promised. Further we request that a third-party company be retained to verify that the contractor actually does what they are contractually meant to do which is to polish all stainless steel to 600 grit.

# 5 - Buddleja in Weonga / Rodney Reserves

# 6 - Removing the acacia in Weonga and Raleigh Reserve.

Response from council to our previous motion was that they could not find the offending trees.

Motion 3 - DHP again requests that council remove the wrongly planted acacia subspecies that was meant to be low growing shrubs but ended up being high growing trees in Weonga and Raleigh Reserves. Residents and visitors come to the cliff walks to see whales and the ocean. The wrongly planted acacia was already removed in the Dover Road Safety Slope. Please complete the job by removing the wrongly planted acacia in Weonga and Raleigh Reserve on the cliff side of the fence so that ocean views may be restored.

# 8 - KURB Build out at Hunter and Military Road

We had a motion at the last meeting regarding this issue. Council responded as follows:

Council notes the feedback from Dover Heights Precinct, however, at the July 2023 Waverley Traffic Committee, Council has approved the curb build out option at Military Road and Hunter Street, Dover Heights. Works are scheduled to occur in the 24/25 financial year.

Motion 8 – Landslips in Rodney Reserve – council is completing geotechnical investigation and promises to report back in early 2024.

Motion 9 – Pinch Points – Will suggest new pinch points in general business.

Motion 10 – Filming in Waverley

Residents are meant to get notice 5 working days in advance notice of any filming.

Council noted that they cannot refuse filming requests by law. NSW legislation obligates council to approve ALL film production to support the industry.

Residents request that council enforce the 5 day advance notice period.

**MOTION 4** - DHP requests that council trim the verge between 247 and 249 Military Road which blocks the preexisting ocean views of the residents at 264, 266, 268 and 270 Military Road. The newly planted acacia which has already grown to block views should be removed and all OLD dead branches and shrubs

should be removed. The area should be replanted with native plants which will never grow to more than 1.5 meters in height.
