		 Considering environmental and public health risk the following points are worth noting: Whilst the wastewater from this activity should be discharged to sewer, there is very minimal risk of a pollution incident occurring as the water filters into the sand at the point of discharge or within proximity to it. There is minimal risk of 'unsafe, or unhealthy conditions' being created as there is no ponding of wastewater, slip hazards or other obstructions noted at this site. The community benefit from being provided with a shower facility would appear to outweigh any negative affect from the discharge of the water to sand. Council does have a plan to rectify the pipework at this site. However, there is no urgency from a risk perspective to address this in the short term. Incidental risk of ingestion of sand from the point of discharge = very low – primary consideration being PICA behaviour by 		

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		children or infants. Parental supervision and occupation of this area near the open-end pipework highly unlikely. 6. Incidental risk of any recreational water contamination very low or unlikely. Assessment based on distance from point source of discharge to low water mark of beach and absorption of water discharged. 7. Incidental discharge of aerosolised particulate matter from point of wastewater discharge to sand deemed low or insignificant. 8. No evidence of nuisance created by vegetative growth (e.g., algae of significance) at the time of inspection. Recommendation/conclusion At the time of inspection there was no nuisance being created and therefore it is recommended that no further action be taken. Council should monitor the situation on a regular basis and should the discharging water give rise to a nuisance or hazard then appropriate action should be taken. Please note, in NSW, a health nuisance typically refers to any condition or activity that may pose a threat to public health or cause discomfort. It includes issues like noise, pollution or unsanitary conditions that affect public healthy. Unsanitary conditions in the context of this definition implies exposure to sewage or other biological hazards.
