4.	<p><b>Thinker in Residence – Regen Waverley by Manager, Sustainability &amp; Resilience, Environmental Sustainability, Suzanne Dunford</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Suzanne explained that she manages Second Nature, Council’s Environmental Education and Engagement Program that works to meet Community and Council’s environmental goals.</li> <li>• The thinker in Residence model was first proposed by Council in 2017, and further explored in a 2018 recommending the <i>Boot Factory</i> as a dedicated civic space</li> <li>• The Thinker in Residence EOI focussed on Sustainability, Resilience Urbanism and circular economy to showcase adaptive reuse and create a sustainable innovation and collaboration precinct.</li> <li>• In late 2023, there was an EOI seeking academics, non-profit organisations, change agents, and experts in sustainability, climate resilience, urbanism, and circular economy to host tailored and curated programs, to connect people and activities</li> <li>• In 2024 Regen was awarded \$50,000 to run events and engagement on sustainability innovation.</li> <li>• Over 18 Regen events have been hosted across the LGA (at the Boot Factory, Margaret Whitlam, Bondi Pavilion, parks and homes)</li> <li>• Next steps include monitoring cornerstone indicators, encouraging active citizenship / assemblies, e.g. Precincts, continuing innovation, sustainability and resilience programming, sharing learnings with other Councils and institutions and encourage new members!</li> </ul> <p>Action: CCL to send link to Regen Sydney website  <a href="https://www.regen.sydney/">https://www.regen.sydney/</a></p> <p>Action: CCL to send link to Donut Economics  <a href="https://doughnuteconomics.org/about-doughnut-economics">https://doughnuteconomics.org/about-doughnut-economics</a></p>

	<p>Cr Frazer assured attendees that extensive Community Consultation will occur.</p> <p><b>4. Mia V – Charing Cross Precinct</b></p> <p>The Combined Precincts move that Waverley Council make any development application consent conditional on the completion of the repair and restoration of the stormwater easement from High Street to Prospect Street, which is on the southern boundary of the property (19 Prospect Street, Waverley).</p> <p>That Waverley Council make financial and logistical provisions for the completion of the repair and restoration of the stormwater pipes in this stormwater easement.</p> <p>Rationale</p> <p>The stormwater easement is in disrepair, and Council engineers agree that the pipe is too narrow at the Prospect Street end.</p> <p>Herbert Lam, Project Manager – Civic Infrastructure, Major Projects, Waverley Council, advises that the pipe needs to be replaced to prevent flooding in High Street.</p> <p>In 2024, when the stormwater easement, from High Street and the drains in High Street were upgraded (Waverley Council Reference D24/41224), the pipe at the Prospect Street end of the easement could not be widened because of the proximity of the boundary wall of 19 Prospect Street.</p> <p>A condition of consent of this DA must require the replacement of the stormwater pipe. Requests Council to conduct community consultation on measures to improve pedestrian safety and traffic calming in Glenayr Avenue at the intersection of Warners Avenue, including the Council proposed pedestrian crossing in Glenayr Avenue between Warners Avenue and the Seven Ways roundabout.</p> <p data-bbox="268 439 408 465">Background</p> <p data-bbox="268 510 1485 680">Part of the Bondi Local Area Traffic Management study report to Council in April 2025 included a table that showed many traffic proposals being considered by Council. All but one of these proposals was identified by Council officers for community consultation. The one proposal that was not slated for community consultation (but instead, for only informing the community) was the proposed Glenayr Avenue pedestrian crossing to be located between the Seven Ways roundabout and Warners Avenue.</p> <p data-bbox="268 725 1485 860">Councillors may not have been aware of this distinction when voting on the matter and so therefore endorsed (perhaps by accident) that the community (maybe the local community) only be INFORMED about the proposed pedestrian crossing just before construction work takes place to implement the crossing. There are many issues with the proposal, as articulated in the points below.</p> <p data-bbox="268 904 1485 1003">If the proposed pedestrian crossing is implemented, it could negatively impact public transport traffic, Hunter and Bondi Ward residents and all other vehicles passing through the Seven Ways intersection. Hence, why it is considered as a matter of interest for the Combined Precincts.</p> <p data-bbox="268 1048 1485 1182">The motion reflects Council’s oversight and requests that Council reconsider its decision to just inform the local community and instead consult the community on the proposed pedestrian crossing and other pedestrian safety measures. A motion with similar intentions was endorsed last year by the Bondi Beach and Bondi precincts.</p> <p data-bbox="268 1227 580 1254">Issues about the Proposal:</p> <ol data-bbox="363 1299 1485 2033" style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="363 1299 1485 1469">1. Council is proposing to only INFORM the community prior to the implementation of an at-grade pedestrian crossing at Location 6 of the Bondi Local Area Traffic Management Project, being the Glenayr Ave/Warners Ave intersection, to the south of the Seven Ways roundabout and north of Warners Ave (refer to Council’s Strategic Planning and Development Committee item PD/5.3/25.04, pages 26 and 172 of the agenda).</li> <li data-bbox="363 1469 1485 1612">2. Waverley Council’s proposal (‘The Proposal’) does not agree with that in the ‘GHD consultants’ Bondi LATMS Treatment Report – Stage 1 - 29 July 2024’ (see pages 23 &amp; 24). The former proposes an at-grade’ pedestrian crossing north of Warners while the latter proposes it south of Warners Ave.</li> <li data-bbox="363 1612 1485 1711">3. The key pedestrian desire line is probably aligned with the traffic island to the immediate south of Warners Ave, as per ‘GHD consultants’ Bondi LATMS Treatment Report – Stage 1 - 29 July 2024’.</li> <li data-bbox="363 1711 1485 1899">4. ‘GHD consultants’ Bondi LATMS Treatment Report – Stage 1 – 29 July 2024’ states that a flat zebra crossing immediately south of Warners Ave could be warranted if pedestrian demand is high enough BUT that a flat crossing would not reduce vehicle speeds on approach; so, the report concludes that there would only be a slight improvement in pedestrian safety / reduced risk of incident.</li> <li data-bbox="363 1899 1485 2033">5. If the proposed GHD pedestrian crossing location was pursued, a planted kerb build out might be needed (like recently implemented in Farrellys Ave and proposed for the intersection of O’Brien St &amp; Barracluff Ave (location 1). Having said that, the current outward bound bus zone may require relocation and parking could be lost.</li> </ol>

	<p>6. 'The Proposal' (not the GHD alternative) is unlikely to reduce the pedestrian count at the Warners Ave traffic island to catch the morning bus to Bondi Junction. It is likely that the number of pedestrians crossing at 'The Proposal's location, if installed, would not increase from current volumes, which is already considered low, and therefore the new pedestrian crossing might rarely be used.</p> <p>7. 'The Proposal' would force vehicles to stop through the intersections of Glenayr/Warners and the roundabout at Glenayr/Blair. A right turn out of Warners Ave into Glenayr Ave would be constrained by northbound vehicles waiting for pedestrians to cross. This, in turn, could delay movement of southbound traffic. Vehicles could also tail back into the roundabout and cause congestion for east and west bound Blair Street traffic.</p> <p>8. This is a bus route, so bus travel times could be degraded by congestion at the intersections.</p> <p>9. The GHD proposal could cause traffic congestion as vehicles attempt to turn right from Warners Ave into Glenayr Ave are blocked by southbound Glenayr Ave traffic waiting for pedestrians to cross.</p> <p>10. A raised pedestrian crossing would act as a traffic calming measure to slow traffic and increase pedestrian safety. It would be a maximum height of 700mm being that Glenayr Ave is a bus route and so increase in traffic noise levels would be minimal.</p> <p>11. Both concepts, with each having their pros and cons, could be presented to the Waverley Local Transport Forum for advice before being presented to the community and local precinct committees, including at least Hunter and Bondi ward precincts.</p> <p>Moved: Mel W Second: Rex W</p> <p>Amendment suggested by Peter Q to delete the words 'Notes'. 3.	<p><b>What issues to be watching and advising the Precincts about?</b></p> <p><u>Housing Delivery Authority (HDA)</u></p> <p>The following projects have been considered by the HDA since the preparation of the previous subcommittee report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 122-128 Hewlett Street, Bronte – proposing 100-120 dwellings across 9 storeys. Recommended by the HDA.</li> <li>• 1 The Avenue, Rose Bay (and adjoining sites) – proposing 100 dwellings across 8 storeys.
