At a public meeting held on 20th August, 1962 at the 'Bondi Beach Esplanade', it was resolved:

"That a Society be formed and that it be named 'The Waverley Historical Society'"

The Constitution of the Society was adopted on 19 November, 1962:

"The objects of the Society shall be to encourage the study of Australian History, the advancement of the knowledge of, and the study of, every aspect of the history of Waverley and district and any other matter of historical interest, and for the collection and preservation of records of any of the said matters."

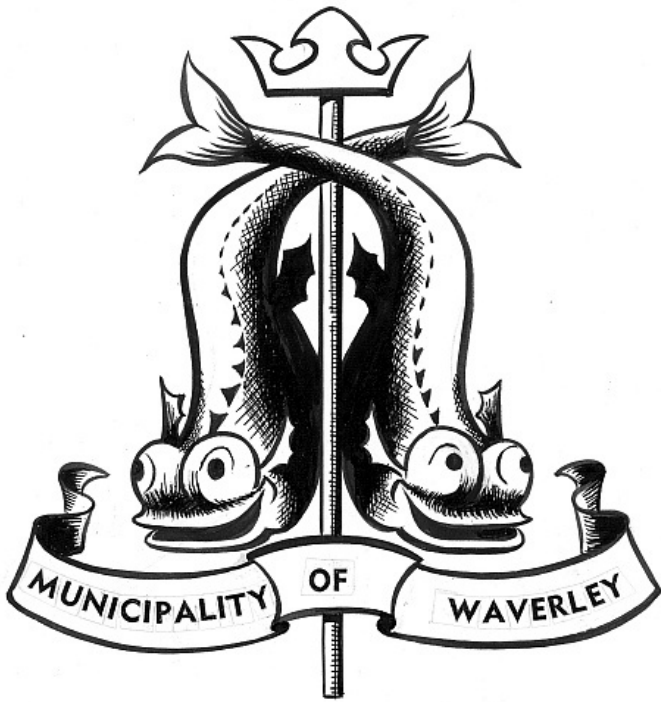
The foundation members were a very distinguished group.

Judge Thomas, the Society's Foundation President, delivered the first Paper, entitled "Anniversary Day", which was the name then given to Australia Day. Throughout the years the Society has presented a long series of lectures of historical interest and visits to historical sites.

Today, the Society's letterhead features the Emblem of the Waverley Council, of two dolphins and Neptune's trident, adopted by Council in 1915, and which is symbolic of Waverley's seaside location.

Booklets have been published on such subjects as: "Bronte House and Robert Lowe", "La Vicomte de Laperouse", "Thomas West Convict Transportee", and a nine-volume series compiled by Hon. Life Member Jack Atkins on a wide range of local interest subjects.

The Society's original choice of letterhead was an image of 'Waverley House' which gave its' name to the municipality. The house had been built in 1827 by Barnett Levey who was the first Jewish free settler in Australia and founder of the Theatre Royal, Australia's first legitimate theatre.
