# Overdevelopment

Di invited Clr Wy Kanak to give Precinct attendees an update on a Mayoral minute passed at the last Council meeting (15 February 2022) pertaining to overdevelopment and its impact on the local community.

Clr Wy Kanak told the meeting that the Mayoral minute, titled *The Lived Experience of Overdevelopment*, would gather information submitted by the community about the cumulative impacts of overdevelopment, including socio-psychological and resilience impacts on residents.

Clr Wy Kanak said The Mayoral Minute also requested Council officers investigate the establishment of a Community Planning Advocate position within Waverley Council. The role would look at a broader appreciation of overdevelopment rather strict bricks and mortar controls which would hopefully be considered in the planning process.

Clr Wy Kanak told the meeting the Council's Social Impact Assessment Plan would likely be presented at the next Council meeting which hopefully would make it easier for the community to not only make direct submissions about planning controls, but to look at the social psychological and resilience impacts of overdevelopment.

The meeting thanked Clr Wy Kanak for his input.

The meeting also discussed the difficulties of local communities fighting developments that were outside Council's control.

#### Motion 1

Bondi Precinct writes to all Waverley Councillors asking them to resolve to write to the Minister of Planning/Premier, as a matter of urgency, to request that the DPIE restores Council's legislative powers to enable local decision making and to uphold the LEP and DCP and in doing so respect and restore the rights of local communities and considers a joint Waverley/Woollahra/Randwick/Sydney City Council submission to the Minister to the same effect.

## **DA Update**

DA-552/2021 – An update was given on the development proposal at 26-32 Hall Street.

There was a lengthy discussion about this DA and the broader issue of tree protection and root management systems in the public domain. (NB: The item will be included on the agenda of the next meeting.)

Bondi Precinct opposes **DA-552/2021** on the grounds it is an extensive overdevelopment of the site, exceeds height controls, will detract from the village atmosphere of Hall Street, does not comply with traffic conditions and involves the removal of an important canopy tree.

# **Parking**

Tight parking in Bondi was discussed, and the number of large, residential multi-storey developments planned for the area which will put hundreds more cars onto the roads.

The Beach Parking Scheme was also discussed, and concerns were raised that Queen Elizabeth Drive was becoming a carpark and not meeting the needs of the community.

Bondi Precinct requests Council officers review and investigate the current use of beach parking, whether Queen Elizabeth Drive is being used as a long-term parking lot and whether the Beach Parking Scheme meets the access needs of resident beachgoers including the elderly, disabled and children.

# **Traffic and transport**

The precinct was provided a history to the proposed Barracluff Avenue traffic calming trial and failed attempts by the community to get traffic counts conducted before and after the trial in surrounding streets so the impact of the measures could be properly assessed.

# Motion 4

In light of undertakings given by our newly elected Ward Councillors in the lead up to last year's Local Government elections, Bondi Precinct requests that traffic counts be conducted in streets surrounding Barracluff Avenue before and after proposed traffic calming measures are introduced. The surrounding streets include: Wellington St, Lamrock St, Francis Street, Rickard Avenue and Sir Thomas Mitchell Road.
