3. Cycling Projects Update		
3.1 Bondi Junction Cycleway	Construction of first section of Spring St now complete and the road will reopen by weekend. Construction has moved to northern section of Spring St. No decision as yet from L&E Court. Business case for further funding signed off by Council.	
3.2 Henrietta Street	Henrietta St has been resurfaced, painting and line marking commenced. Later works held up by fire bans.	
3.3 Old South Head Road shared path	Rebuilding of the existing shared path from Bon Accord Ave to the red light cameras near Bondi Road should be done later this year. Pavement markings as per the section of shared path to Victoria Road were approved by Traffic Committee.	
	Discussion on-going with RMS re the crossing at Bondi Road to the future Bondi Junction Cycleway which will terminate on the western side of Bondi Road.	
	Continuous footpath crossing concepts at Paul Street and Bon Accord Ave have been approved by Traffic Committee. Funding for detailed design and construction has been requested.	
3.4 Paul Street	Line-marking Paul Street for on-road cycling with upgrade to shared path and crossing at the Bondi Road signalised pedestrian crossing approved by Traffic Committee. Funding sought under the Long Term Financial Plan.	
3.5 Queens Park Cycleway	Concept and detailed design are complete and project ready to go once funded. Application for funding in 2019-20 was unsuccessful. Will resubmit for 2020-21. Committee noted that the Minister for Planning was interested in using public spaces for cycleways. Action: Resolve that there be a Motion to Council to write to the Minister for Planning for support for funding this cycleway on public space.	
4. Update on Ride2Work Day Event	Successful event for bike riders with croissants and fruit, coffee from the markets cart and bike checks held in Oxford Street Mall. Information collected on route riders used. Noted that event location will change once the Bondi Junction Cycleway is open.	
5. Terms of Reference Discussion	Discussion about the addition of KPI's to the Committee Terms of Reference to identify outcomes that may include the following metrics:	
	- Metres of separated cycleway	

- Cycling participation rates
- No of issues actioned

Action: Prepare a draft section for inclusion of KPI's in the Terms of Reference for circulation prior to next meeting.

6. Strategic review for revised bike plan

Review of options for the top priority routes:

1. East / west Bondi Beach to Bondi Junction

Discussion of various options for this route including: Birriga Road, Old South Head Road, Martins Ave, Bondi Rd and Birrell Street.

Upgrading Curlewis St to separation was seen as a top priority both for its connection to Birriga/Old South Head Road (BJ) and O'Sullivan (Rose Bay). RMS funding was unsuccessful the past 2 years. Trial separation proposed.

Committee requested that an update from Woollahra re their proposals for cycleway along O'Sullivan Road be presented at the next WCAC meeting.

Action: Resolve that there be a Motion to Council prepare a report as to the steps required so that a trial of a separated bike path can be implemented on Curlewis Street.

Action: Discuss with Woollahra approach to O'Sullivan Rd and combined approach to 5-ways intersection.

Action: Prepare a discussion paper of benefits and difficulties of various routes between BJ and Beach.

2. North / south Bondi Junction to Randwick

Committee decided that Bronte Road was the only suitable route for the priority bike route for the north-south connection due to:

- its gradient, (former tram route)
- access to local destinations,
- slower speed road environment,
- existing tree cover,
- Carrington Rd is a higher speed arterial.

Carrington Road is seen as the major vehicular traffic route that carries through traffic to Syd Einfeld Dve.

3. Other infrastructure strategies

The committee also recommended other types of infrastructure to connect to these priority routes. These included shared zones, contra-flow cycling, cut throughs and strategic shared paths.

	Wayfinding and legibility of existing routes requires review and improvement. Strategy for assisting infrequent riders to identify routes is required.		
	Small improvements at multiple locations were discussed to improve ease of riding at a range of locations.		
	Action: Circulate a map to for Committee Members to identify locations for suggested improvements.		
7. Other Issues	AB submitted an Infrastructure Progress Matrix of initiatives and ideas that have been discussed OR might want to be discussed.		
	Installation of signage, such as destination and Bicycle Excepted signs, was identified as potential low cost items to improve the network.
