# **Business Relief package**

Council's relief package continues to support local businesses through a range of measures including fee waivers and rent relief. Small business drives the Waverley economy and we congratulate our small business owners and employees for diversifying and adapting to the changing restrictions.

# **Bushfire support**

In February 2020, the NSW government on behalf of all local councils, commissioned the notfor-profit organisation GIVIT to coordinate the provision of muchneeded goods and services to bushfire-affected communities across the state. As part of this initiative, staff from Waverley Council were deployed to Councils in bushfire-affected regions to support those communities. There was also an outpouring of support from the eastern suburbs community, including Waverley's four surf clubs. In January, Bondi Surf Club acted as a relief centre, with hundreds of residents and businesses volunteering their time to sort through more than 30 truck-loads of supplies donated by the community for evacuation centres and firefighters on the NSW South Coast. The Club also set aside a further 80 pallets of supplies to support tourism events post-recovery. Council supported the Club's relief efforts by providing logistical management and other measures.

# **Connected communities**

Our priority is to help keep the community safe and connected. Earlier in the pandemic, we launched our Connected Waverley Facebook group as a way for people to share volunteering opportunities, promote grassroots, community-led initiatives, connect and support neighbours and request assistance and share resources. We also developed community cards for each household in Waverley to enable residents to offer and request support during this pandemic. Through our Community Housing Manager, we continue to liaise with our social and affordable housing tenants to ensure they are supported. We continue to provide our Waverley Community Living Program, with one-on-one support and services by remote and face-to-face means.

# Keep it Local

As part of our \$1 million permonth Business Relief Package, we enlisted the Bondi & Districts Chamber of Commerce to provide consulting and advisory services to help with our planning for medium and long-term relief measures once pandemic restrictions have eased or ended. Together we also launched Keep it Local, an online directory to support and promote local business. See page 11 for more.

# **Community Small Grants**

Council allocates funds of approximately \$100,000 each financial year for small grants. These funds give community members the opportunity to take the lead on addressing issues and creating outcomes that are important to them. With Council recently endorsing an increase in the amount of funding available to applicants, there's never been a better time to apply for grants of up to \$5,000. See our website for more.

# Community groups

Council continues to support local essential services providers, grassroots initiatives and community groups such as the Waverley Community and Seniors Association, Our Big Kitchen and others, in helping vulnerable people and assist to contain the spread of COVID 19.

# Waverley Library

The community embraced reading during the pandemic with more than 240,000 books and other material borrowed from Waverley Library this year. During the pandemic closure, the library continued to offer online resources for members and staff provided welfare checks on registered clients of our Home Library Services. # HAVE A COVID-SAFE SUMMER IN WAVERLEY



The COVID-19 pandemic has changed the way we use our public spaces. Waverley Council's Summer 2020-21 Outdoor Public Spaces Operational Management Plan outlines Council's measures for managing its beaches and open spaces in a COVID-safe way and in line with Public Health Orders (PHOs) and health advice.

The Plan outlines the arrangements for the management of outdoor public space across the Waverley Council local government area, including Waverley's beaches, parks and coast walk, during the COVID-19 pandemic. Beach Ambassadors and other Council staff are available to help, and Council will continue to manage our beaches and open spaces in line with our Summer Plan.

For a safe summer, always remember to:

- Stay at least one towel-length apart from others unless from the same household
- Wear a mask when appropriate
- Ensure outdoor gatherings are limited to numbers outlined in the current Public Health Orders
- Wash your hands / use hand sanitiser
- Stay home if unwell
- Get tested
- Follow instructions from Lifeguards, Rangers, Beach Ambassadors and the police



# Our friendly Beach Ambassadors

Our Beach Ambassadors are here to make your visit to Bondi, Bronte and Tamarama beaches as safe and enjoyable as possible. They work in tandem with our Rangers to help inform the community about the latest Public Health Orders and health advice, so do say hello to the team in bright blue shirts next time you are visiting our area. Our Beach Ambassadors and Rangers don't have the power to fine people for breaking the Public Health Orders (PHOs), so please contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 if you see anything that you believe is outside the PHOs. Through cooperation and kindness, we can all help keep each other safe.

Check our website and social media channels for up-to-the minute information about how busy our beaches are. Also keep a look out for advisory messages at bus stops, train stations and on major roads. If you intend to use our beaches, parks and outdoor spaces and they look busy, please come back another time or use that time to visit one of our many local businesses - they need your support. We will be making sure our beaches don't get too crowded and that everyone can enjoy our beautiful public spaces safely. If we do reach capacity, then access to the sand will be restricted until numbers stabilise so that everyone has a turn! Most importantly, if you are feeling unwell, please stay at home and get tested, and remain in isolation until you receive a negative result.

# **Transport options**

Before you hop in the car, check parking availability at Bondi and Bronte with the Park n' Pay app. If you are catching public transport and can't social distance, remember it's highly recommended to wear a mask. If you're spending the day outside, please remember to stay COVID safe by keeping one towel-length apart from the person next to you unless you are from the same household and ensure outdoor gatherings are limited to numbers outlined in the current Public Health Orders.

# Beach bag essentials

Heading outdoors? Don't forget to pack your hat, sunglasses, water, sunscreen, a mask and sanitiser when heading to the beach. We will be making sure our beaches don't get too crowded and that everyone can enjoy our beautiful public spaces safely.

# Alcohol-free zones

To keep our beaches, parks and streets safe, we have a number of alcohol-free zones in place throughout the year. Bondi, Tamarama and Bronte beaches, coastal parks and public streets are classified as alcohol-free zones. This means you are not permitted to consume alcohol in these areas. Rangers work closely with the Police to ensure the restrictions are observed and to help keep everyone safe.

A reminder that smoking is not permitted at Waverley's beaches. Please dispose of your rubbish thoughtfully and always bin your butts.



# Surf safety

There is no such thing as a "safe" beach. Surf and weather conditions can change at any moment, so our Council Lifeguards recommend beachgoers:

Always swim between the red and yellow flags, never swim outside them.

Do not swim directly after a meal or if under the influence of alcohol.

Only swim when the red and yellow flags are flying. If there are no flags, the beach is closed or unpatrolled.

Do not panic if caught in a current or undertow. Raise one arm into the air to signal for lifeguard assistance. Float until help arrives.

Do not struggle if seized with a cramp. Raise your arm for help and float. Keep the part of your body that is cramping perfectly still.

Do not swim if unsure of surf conditions. Always seek the advice of a lifeguard or lifesaver.

If you witness an in-water emergency, please inform our Council Lifeguards, or if it is after hours, dial Triple Zero **(000)** and ask for the Police. Our current lifeguard patrols hours are 6am to 7pm at Waverley's three beaches.

# MAJOR PROJECTS UPDATE





Although the final four months of the 2019-20 financial year were financially challenging due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Council completed a range of existing projects making Waverley a better place to live, work and visit. We have planted more trees, widened footpaths, increased safety lighting and have helped our residential buildings and schools reduce their carbon footprint. We have invested and diverted significant funds to assist businesses and the community through the impacts of the pandemic whilst supporting the construction industry and local jobs.

## Bondi Cycleway and Streetscape Upgrade

Waverley Council's Bondi Junction Cycleway and Streetscapes Upgrade project reached another milestone with the completion of streetscape works along Spring Street. These works will enhance the retail experience of this busy area of Bondi Junction and already the area is looking greener and more inviting. The upgrade is a priority of Waverley **Council's Complete Streets Project** to enhance Bondi Junction and its spaces by greening and beautifying footpaths and public places, making meeting places more vibrant and appealing, and improving connections for cycling, walking and access to public transport. The Cycleways project has received significant funding the Commonwealth and New South Wales Government through the \$240 million jointly funded Pinch Point Program to make Sydney's metropolitan road network more efficient for



all transport users, supporting 1000 direct and indirect jobs.

## Seven Ways

Council completed its streetscape upgrade at the Seven Ways community village centre located at the intersection of Glenayr Avenue, Warners Avenue and Blair Street, Bondi. There is now a large green space for families to play as well as new seating and planting. The new village plaza has helped meet residents' social and recreation needs whilst supporting local small business.

## Notts Avenue Safety & Streetscape Upgrade

In early December 2020, Council was preparing to unveil its safety and streetscape upgrade of Notts Avenue, Bondi Beach. This has been a significant project to transform one of Waverley's most highlyvisited locations. The upgrade includes a 10km/h shared zone, new paving, upgraded balustrades, a shade structure, mature trees and a stunning cantilevered northern lookout. The project will improve the safety and amenity for residents and businesses as well as the one million or so people who visit the Bondi to Bronte Coastal Walk each year.

## Diamond Bay Reserve Boardwalk remediation works

In June 2020, we completed necessary maintenance and repairs to the boardwalks between Eastern Avenue Reserve and Diamond Bay Reserve. The remediation works



included securing timber balustrades with additional fixings, ensuring stairways and walkways were secure and replacing stainless-steel wires, posts, timber handrails, some stair treads and walkway timbers. Over the next two years it is our intention to completely replace Eastern Avenue and Diamond Bay Reserves' boardwalks.

# Bronte Village Centre Upgrade

In 2020, we completed our upgrade of the Bronte Beach village centre. The upgrade provides a unique arrival experience for users of Bronte Park, Village Centre and Bronte Beach. We improved pedestrian safety by increasing the available footpath for pedestrians along Bronte Road and provided an integrated link that connects the park, beach and village centre with the bus interchange. We planted extra trees, installed bicycle parking and improved the overall look and feel our beautiful Bronte village.



## Bondi Pavilion Restoration & Conservation Project

In June 2020, we commenced our restoration of the iconic Bondi Pavilion with head contractor BuildCorp. The heritage restoration will take around 18 months to complete and include new and improved amenities, a Bondi Story Room, a new tourist centre/box office, a community radio station, renovated community spaces and a renovated art gallery and theatre, just to name a few. We are also working to appoint a vibrant mix of retail businesses through a tender process to operate from the iconic building from when it reopens. We can't wait to unveil the new and improved Bondi Pavilion in 2022!



# Bondi Memorial Project

In August 2020, Waverley Council and LGBTQ+ health organisation ACON announced that Urban Art Projects will be commissioned to create the Bondi Memorial Project at Marks Park, Tamarama. UAP's concept design Rise was one of six shortlisted designs for the permanent memorial to acknowledge the gay and transgender people who were targeted in homophobic attacks from the 1970s to 1990s in Sydney. Several of these crimes took place in Marks Park on the Bondi coastline. UAP's sixlevel stone terrace representing the six bands in the pride flag responded beautifully to the project's guiding principles of remembrance, diversity, inclusion, justice and acceptance. Construction of the memorial is expected to take place in 2021. Council is contributing \$100,000 to the project with ACON contributing a further \$64,000 through donations. # The Boot Factory

In September 2020, Council endorsed the preferred option of the Innovation Civic Hall for the Boot Factory in Spring Street Bondi Junction, and the design of fit-out of the building. It follows

the completion of the investigation of a Knowledge and Innovation Hub precinct within the Waverley local government area, as defined by the Council resolution in October 2017. Staff will start to work soon on the future operational management model for the Innovation Civic Hall (illustrated- below) with a report to come back to Council on final costings, programming, sponsorship and staffing. Officers will also further investigate a maker space at Waverley Library, with a report to come back to Council. The Boot Factory, a former shoemaking factory at the rear of Norman Lee Place at 27-33 Spring Street, was completed in 1892 by William Sidaway and Son and was last restored by Council in 1986. It has been vacant since 2007, and in 2013, Council undertook significant remedial structural works to ensure the stability of the building until an alternative use could be found.

### Arden Street Safety Upgrade

To ensure we provide a safer environment for the local community, we are about to start on the final stages of the Arden Street Safety Upgrade. The construction on this project has been staged across 2020/21.

For the first part of the upgrade, we relocated the existing state bus stop to help visibility, installed new signage and formalised the school bus zone.

Now we will:

- Upgrade the pedestrian crossing signals
- Widen the footpath
- Install kerb treatments to slow traffic



# Solar shining in our suburbs

Sunshine is spreading across our 'hood with local schools, clubs and apartment buildings joining the solar power revolution. Participants in Solar my School, Solar my Club and the new Solar my Strata pilot program are receiving tailored Council support to help navigate the often complex process of capturing renewable energy on their rooftops.

# New ways to get rid of it right

Waverley's problem waste recycling stations continue to expand and accept more products! This year, we added x-rays, light globes and oral care to the long list of items that can be recycled at Waverley Library and the Customer Service Centre, such as batteries, mobile phones and ink cartridges. The stations offer a free, safe and easy way to recycle items that shouldn't be placed in our kerbside bins. There's more to look forward to in 2021 with plans to launch a series of drop-off recycling events to safely dispose, recycle and reuse problem waste. Next year, residents will be able to drop off bulk cardboard, polystyrene, soft plastics, textiles and e-waste at the Waverley/Woollahra Depot on 67a Bourke Road in Alexandria. The first drop off will be held on Saturday 6 February.

# COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT UPDATE

2020 has been an interesting year for engagement! Due to COVID-19, face-to-face opportunities were halted and we moved to online methods to ensure everyone could still engage in Council's decision-making process.

Since March, we have run over 10 webinar sessions, enabling many of you to watch and join in from the comfort of your own home. Considering the success and take-up of these online sessions, we will look to continue running these, even as the COVID-19 restrictions are easing.

Also, with Council meetings moving online, and community members unable to attend in person, we accepted video recording and written speeches to ensure you were still able to have your voice heard. Throughout 2020, we had 50 consultations provided via Have Your Say Waverley. We heard from about 3000 community members, who either filled in a survey, contributed an idea, or completed a poll – this doesn't even include those who attended a webinar or emailed us directly! The projects you were most interested in were the Bronte Surf Club and Community Facilities Upgrade, Bondi Memorial Public Artwork, and the potential Timed Off-leash Dogs Trial at Mackenzies Bay.

#### Library lovers

Reading has always been a joy to our local community, but with more time at home this year, Waverley Library was in demand! Waverley Library launched Grab & Go and Ready, Set, Borrow to ensure people could get their Library fix safely. We moved over 170 workshops, author talks and discussion groups online, and launched the Waverley Library App allowing access to the library, its member services and collections from any smart device 24/7.

#### The power of music

Music has the incredible ability to bring people together, boost your mood and encourage creativity. We saw this demonstrated through a number of our music programs which were adjusted to online platforms. The Bondi WAVE Youth Band Songwriting Program produced 12 original songs, our seniors' concerts are streamed on Facebook live, allowing the entire community to enjoy performances by local musicians, and Council's seniors' choir, the Sunshine Singers, is so successful online that they've even acquired some new recruits!

#### Learn a new skill

Many of our newly online programs such as the School Holiday, Sydney Craft Week and Festival of the Winds programs taught our community weird and wonderful things – like how to crochet, how to design a tattoo, how to make and fly a kite and loads more! Thousands of people joined us online, exploring their creativity whilst learning something new.

# Small Grants Program

Each year, we ask community members to get in touch with Council if they have a great idea that would benefit the local community but need some help getting their project off the ground. 
