

Approved plant list

All species on this list are generally recommended for use throughout Waverley Cemeteries. Consultation with the Cemetery Office is recommended for the selection of the most appropriate plant species for each grave site. Alternative species may be approved by Cemetery Management.

Trees and or large shrubs are not permitted to be planted on grave sites and will be pruned if necessary to maintain access to memorialisation.

It is important to remember that all plant species require a certain level of ongoing care, maintenance, and attention. After preparation and planting of a grave site, which can be completed either by the Cemetery Operations for an appropriate fee, or yourself. Regular visitations are recommended for upkeeping of the maintenance over a grave site. For example, weeding, vegetation removal, and watering.
