

Parking Permit Condition of Use

Waverley Council offer parking permits to eligible residents who reside within the Residential Parking Scheme (RPS). To check eligibility visit <u>waverley.nsw.gov.au/residents/parking/permits</u> or contact us by online chat or at 9083 8000. Council also offers a Beach Parking Scheme that allows residents and non-residents unlimited parking in Queen Elizabeth Drive & Park Drive (Bondi Beach) and Bronte Cutting (Bronte).

Parking permits provide greater opportunity to park in some of Waverley's busiest areas, however it does not guarantee the availability of a parking space to the holder.

ELIGIBILITY

- To be eligible for a permit the applicant must be a resident and reside within a Waverley Council Residential Parking Scheme. They can only apply for a permit for the property where they live (excluding Beach permits).
- Residents in a Non-Strata titled Building/Dwelling are only entitled to one Residential Parking Permit per household where there is no off-street parking.
- Residential Parking Permits cannot be issued to a business or business owner.
- Permits are not available for a truck, bus, tram, tractor, trailer (boat or caravan) or a motor vehicle over 4.5 tonnes
- Permits cannot be issued to an unregistered motor vehicle
- Beach permits cannot be issued to a motor vehicle longer than 6 metres
- A maximum of three residential permits may be issued to any residence (conditions apply), however this is reduced by the number of off-street parking spaces available for that household.

CONDITIONS OF USE

- Permits can only be transferred when the <u>original permit is returned</u> and can only be transferred to a vehicle registered in the same name as the original permit holder.
- If the permit is <u>stolen</u> a police report must be provided and a replacement permit will be issued at the replacement fee.
- Permits must be displayed on the bottom left-hand side of the passenger front windscreen (away from any tinted area). For motorcycles/scooters the permit should be displayed in a holder attached to the vehicle.
- Permits must be clearly visible to Authorised Officers at all times.
- In the event of relocation, disposal or sale of the vehicle, the permit must be returned to Waverley Council immediately.
- Permits do not provide the right to park contrary to the Australia Road Rules (e.g. Disabled Parking Areas, Commercial Parking Areas, Clearways and Special Events).
- It is the responsibility of the resident to renew their permit and to display a valid permit when parked in an RPS area.
- Misuse of a permit is an offence. A permit may be revoked by an Authorised Officer for any breach of these conditions.
- Permits are not refundable and Council may withdraw/cancel permits at its discretion.
- Replaced/Damaged/Stolen/Transferred Permits incur a fee on return of the original permit or a police report.

TYPES OF PERMITS

Residential Parking Permit

- Only a resident in the RPS can apply for a Residential Parking Permit which entitles the holder to unrestricted parking where signs display "Permit Holders Excepted" together with the Area to which their permit applies.
- Privately registered vehicles must be registered in NSW at the current Waverley area address.

Annual Visitors Parking Permit

- Only a resident in the RPS can apply for an Annual Visitors Parking Permit on behalf of a visiting vehicle/s not registered in the name and the address on the application form.
- Annual Visitors Parking Permit entitles the holder to unrestricted parking where signs display "Permit Holders
 Excepted" together with the Area to which their permit applies.

Short Term Permit

- Only a resident in the RPS can apply for a Short Term Visitors Parking Permit on behalf of a visiting vehicle/s not registered in the name and the address on the application form.
- Short Term Parking Permit entitles the holder to unrestricted parking where signs display "Permit Holders Excepted" together with the Area to which their permit applies.

Carer Permit

- A Carers Parking Permit is designed to support members of our community who rely on a Carer for support. The applicant must provide Proof of Employment from a registered organisation (e.g. Centrelink, Mission Australia).
- A Carers Parking Permit entitles the holder to unrestricted parking where signs display "Permit Holders Excepted" together with the Area to which their permit applies.

Interim Permit

- An Interim Permit allows a resident time to transfer their vehicle registration details from one address to another.
- The Parking Permit is issued for a period of 30 Days to transfer registration details within NSW or three months for transferring registration details interstate.
- A resident in the RPS can only apply for an Interim Parking Permit once. Interim Parking Permit will not be renewed.
- An Interim Parking Permit entitles the holder to unrestricted parking where signs display "Permit Holders Excepted" together with the Area to which their permit applies.

Beach Permit

- A Resident or a Ratepayer of Waverley Council can apply for a Beach Parking Permit which entitles the holder to unlimited parking only in Queen Elizabeth Drive & Park Drive (Bondi Beach) and Bronte Cutting (Bronte Beach).
- Concessions are available for Pensioners, Senior's, Veterans and Youth Card holders.
- Privately registered vehicles must be registered in NSW at the current Waverley area address to obtain the resident discount (excluding non-resident ratepayers).
- Non-Residents and Business Owners can apply for a Beach Parking Permit, however this is at the full rate (please refer to fees and charges below).

Tradesperson Permit

- A tradesperson Parking Permit is designed to assist residents when they are having work completed at their property.
- Residents may apply for a 7 day Tradespersons Parking Permit for a vehicle that is not registered to the property.
- Tradesperson Parking Permits entitle the permit holder to unrestricted parking where signs say 'Permit Holders
 <u>Excepted'</u> together with the <u>Area</u> to which the permit applies.
