



assessment request by the EPA on the sewer outfalls at Vacluse and Diamond Bay Ocean Outfalls where untreated effluent is being discharged and can pose a risk to public health. They are part of early wastewater system built in 1916 and 1936. SW has put up temporary signs in Eastern Reserve and Diamond Bay to highlight the potential risk at these locations. It is likely that more permanent signage will be installed. SW recommends people avoid fishing, swimming or coming in contact with the water there. There is no comment on the danger to fish or air pollution.

Representative from SW may attend the November Precinct meeting.
