Proof of identity / evidence of hereditary lineage to the rights holder

Applicants must produce two original identification documents, one of which must provide photo identification. These may include a passport, license issued under Australian law (driver's licence or other government-issued licence), birth certificate/citizenship certificate, credit card, EFTPOS card, Medicare card.

Cemetery operator must sign a copy of the Orders of Probate

In the absence of Orders of Probate, applicants need to provide documentary evidence in the form of birth, marriage, death certificates etc. that proves their hereditary lineage to the deceased interment rights holder.

Note: A cemetery operator may refuse to grant or transfer an interment right if, in the operator's opinion, the transfer would tend to create a monopoly or encourage dealing in interment rights. *Cemeteries and Crematoria Act 2013, Section 60*
