A new (ish) technology called road "milling" has supposedly, successfully been used on Lyons Road in Five Dock, sections of Old South Head Road and also Canterbury Road, to scrape the top layer off the cement road slabs and then widen the expansion joints between them. The gaps/joints are then filled resulting in a smooth road surface. The council says they will retest for noise and vibration after the project is completed. I've no idea whether the roads mentioned are comparable to Mitchell Street - in that they were built on sand dunes - however any progress is good progress. There is a budget being allocated to the project in the next financial year and the Infrastructure Team plans on issuing request for tenders in July/August.
