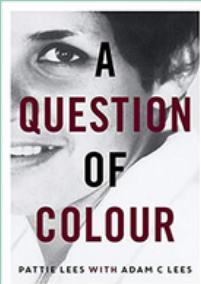

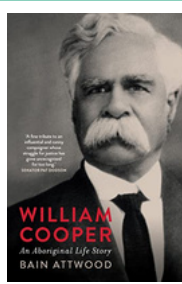
Waverley Council is committed to raising awareness about all forms of racism and its impact by sharing the stories of people who have experienced racism.
