**H**ENRY MONTAGUE FAITHFUL (sic), who was born at Springfield, near Goulburn, on June 16th, 1847, died at Elizabeth Bay, Sydney, on October 22nd, aged 61. He captained Sydney University in the first match against Melbourne University on the Melbourne Ground - in December, 1870 - and in 1871 and 1875 played for New South Wales against Victoria. For many years he filled the position of President of the University C.C. He was right-handed both as batsman and bowler, and was over 6ft. in height.



‘Monty’ Faithfull was identified with sport from his boyhood. “Thirty years ago he was a prominent cricketer, and a member of the University and Albert Cricket Clubs. He frequently represented NSW in interstate and international matches. Standing well over 6ft. His high deliveries were troublesome even to the best of batsmen,” the SMH wrote in its obituary.

At the age of 18 in February 1865, Monty Faithfull had a brush with Ben Hall's bushrangers. With his father and three brothers, he was travelling to Goulburn, when their vehicle was attacked by Hall, John Dunn and Johnny Gilbert. "One of the Messrs Faithfull had a single-barrelled rifle...and another had a revolver, and at once they returned fire," recorded the SMH. They continued to exchange gun fire until their ammunition was nearly exhausted and they commenced a retreat to their house.


## Friends of Waverley Cemeteries
