WAVERLEY NOW




As the financial year ends, we are very proud to report Waverley Council is in a great financial position.

A key highlight of our 2017/18 budget is a budget surplus of \$59,000, and a projected cash and investments balance of \$136 million to deliver our Community Strategic Plan – Waverley Together, in the coming years. This is a great position for Council to be in.

Not only is Waverley in a good financial position, we are tracking well on our promise to you of how we manage our assets, including roads, footpaths, buildings, parks and recreation areas, cemeteries and more. We are pleased to say we are well on target to meeting our 2013 commitment to the community in our ten year Strategic Asset Management Plan.

So far we have upgraded 100 roads, 200 footpaths, 50 kerb and gutters, and 15 parks throughout the area.

Here's just some of the many highlights achieved in the past year around Waverley

Parks and playgrounds

Waverley is proud of its beautiful open spaces, which is why we have ensured our parks and playgrounds are the best they can be.

Highlights from the past 12 months include:

Niblick Reserve

Increased the open space in Waverley by buying a double block in Niblick Street from Sydney Water to retain it as a public park. After remediating work is complete, new play equipment will be installed.

Bondi Park

Five new picnic shelters, new turf on the southern side of the Pavilion and new seating along Campbell Parade providing an opportunity for people to stop, relax or wait while enjoying the view. In addition the North Bondi amenities building was upgraded and existing tunnels under Queen Elizabeth Drive were remediated.

Play spaces

Six play spaces – Dudley Page Reserve, Murrivierie Road Playground, Macpherson Park Playground, O'Donnell Street Reserve Playground, Dickson Park, and Thomas Hogan Reserve were upgraded.

Bronte Pool

Bronte Beach, Park, Promenade and Pool suffered significant damage as a result of storms in June 2016. We took the opportunity to do some significant repairs included relining the pool, reconstructing the ramp access to the beach, rebuilding sections of the wall along the promenade, and turf and planting in the park.

Car Parks

Late last year, Council began major upgrades to our Hollywood, Library and Eastgate car parks. The upgrades are designed to improve safety for drivers and pedestrians, and better meet the needs of car park patrons. The Hollywood and Library car park upgrades were recently completed with Eastgate works expected to be completed later this year. Major improvements include the installation of parking guidance systems showing the number of spaces available, and upgrading lighting to energy efficient LED lights, using less electricity and lowering maintenance costs due to longer life spans.

Waverley Cemetery

With the help of the Residents of Waverley Cemetery, Waverley Cemetery was granted State Heritage listing in late 2016. This shows the heritage significance of the Cemetery and how important it is for Council to ensure it is preserved and protected for future generations. Council has also applied for the Cemetery to be added to the National Heritage list and is awaiting a response. One of the benefits of heritage listing is the availability of access to grant funding. We are also applying for State listing of South Head Cemetery.

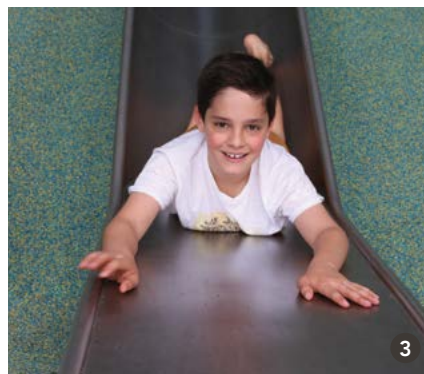
We were delighted to receive a grant to obtain a conservation report on the war memorial at the main entry of the Cemetery and a second to restore one of the Cemetery's monuments.

The entrance to our beautiful cemetery is now more impressive with upgraded and restored gates and fencing. We have rebuilt seven internal roads; repaired internal stairs; replaced and repaired internal fencing; replaced fencing along Fig Tree Lane; as well as restored the picket fence along Trafalgar Street.



Waverley Park

Three new multi-purpose courts for netball, basketball and tennis, as well as a new set of stairs providing access from the recently completed St Mary's Avenue Car Park. We also converted Waverley Park's second playing field to synthetic turf to increase accessibility for use across the year, and installed new field lighting.



LOOKING TO THE FUTURE



The next 12 months will be very exciting as we have many projects we want to roll out to make Waverley a better place to live, visit and work.

Our Operational Plan outlines everything we plan to achieve in the next year and is on our website waverley.nsw.gov.au.

Here is just a few of the major projects we will be working on:

Our cycleways

We are progressing into the detailed design phase of the Bondi Junction Cycleway. We have the support of key government bodies for a separated cycleway route to be implemented along Oxford Street between Bondi Road and York Road and this will include a length of cycleway on Spring Street between Bronte Road and Denison Street. This will remove bikes from the Oxford Street Mall and provide a safer pedestrian environment.

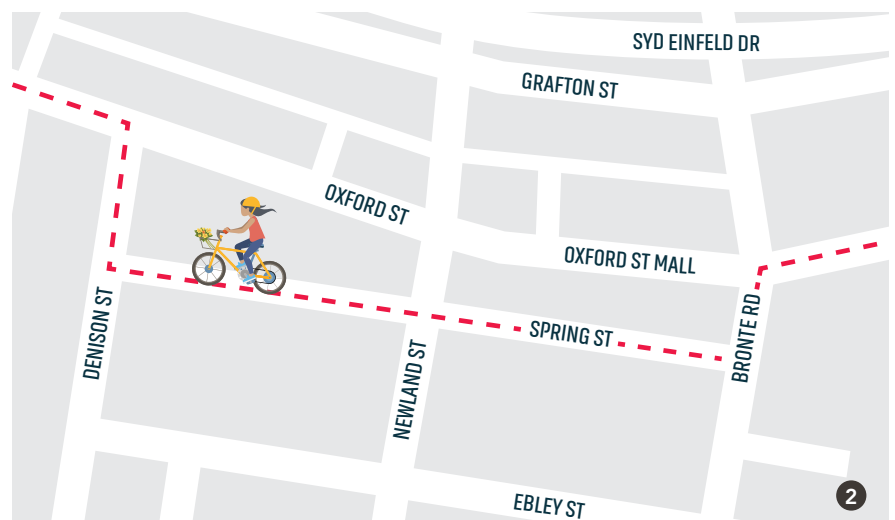

Waverley Cemetery Gully Restoration

The storms of early June 2016 caused severe erosion to the cemetery gully and undermined the structural integrity of the coastal walk so much so that part of the cemetery coastal walk has been diverted. The unique location and constraints of the site have posed numerous issues on how best to approach the remediation of the gully. Council is currently working with engineers and designers on a solution with construction expected to start in late 2017, and take roughly 9-12 months to build.

Key elements of the design include: stabilisation of the embankment with limited removal of landfill material – minimising visual impact on the gully; coastal walk reinstated on similar alignment; stormwater addressed with water sensitive urban design; trees planted in turfed space off main walkway; and creating a place of temporary rest for coastal walk users.



Bondi Park

To continue all the improvements we've been making in and around Bondi Park, next year will see landscape upgrades in the picnic area in the north end of Bondi Park, including more picnic shelters. Our skate park will be getting a refurbishment to improve the safety and use of the skate park, and extend the life of this much-loved facility. Construction will start in late August.



Advanced Waste Treatment

Council is introducing a new way of processing kerb-side waste later this year. The Advanced Waste Treatment (AWT) system takes all the general waste that goes in the red bin, processes it in a closed system under high heat and pressure to create a compost/soil conditioner product that can be applied to various non-residential agricultural crops. The minimal residual waste that is generated goes to landfill.

Once the waste begins to be processed through the AWT, we expect Waverley's waste diversion rate to increase from 34 per cent to 65 percent being diverted from landfill – that's a huge saving for our environment!



Bondi Junction Green Infrastructure Masterplan

In partnership with key building owners and our utilities stakeholders like Sydney Water, Ausgrid and Jemena we have developed our Green Infrastructure Masterplan. It aims to improve the energy, water and waste efficiency of existing and new buildings in Bondi Junction and proposes 19 solutions to assist with a potential to achieve a 33.5 per cent reduction in greenhouse gas emissions, and a 17.9 per cent reduction in the mains water use in Bondi Junction. And cleaner streets!

Over the next 12 months, we'll be implementing energy efficient lighting and air conditioning upgrades on our Council assets such as the Library, Mill Hill Seniors & Community Centre, Customer Service Centre and Waverley Early Education Centre. This will save Council \$120,000/year off our electricity bills in less than five years! We will also progress energy efficient street lighting.

We will introduce raingardens and tree pits with bio-filters to remove pollutants from stormwater, helping to keep Centennial Park ponds clean.

Bondi Junction is the main commercial and retail hub in the East, and is the most resource intense in the Waverley area. So, outside of Council assets, we'll be partnering with apartment, commercial and retail building owners in initiatives to save energy, water and money.

CULTURAL SCENE

Waverley has an amazing array of cultural events run out of the Library, Waverley Woollahra Art School, Bondi Junction Mall and other Council venues. The upcoming line-up at Bondi Pavilion in particular is jam-packed with entertainment...

Bondi Pavilion is world famous for its architecture and location, and for the creative community of Waverley, it's a treasured cultural hub.

The 'Pav', Park and Beach hosts an impressive calendar of events to keep locals entertained year-round. Some of these events include Sculpture by the Sea, Festival of the Winds, Flickerfest, and Carols by the Sea.

Already this year, Bondi Pavilion has played host to Surf's Up, a sizzling summer festival celebrating Bondi's surf culture, Jazz @ The Pav, a month long showcase of jazz music and Home Grown, an acoustic music series of young, emerging artists from the area.

That doesn't even scrape the surface on the ever-changing performances and exhibitions at the Bondi Pavilion Gallery and Theatre. Pop down to the Gallery to see upcoming art exhibitions including *Time and Place* (1–10 August), where Maroubra artist Kate Mulheron explores her home suburb and its identity over time and *Listen to the Land* (22 August–3 September), which explores the spirituality of the Australian landscape from regional artists Meg Sprouster and Barb Strand.

But the best is yet to come! To keep Bondi Beach busy in the cooler months, Waverley Council is bringing back the winter fringe-festival, Bondi Feast. After four hot winters by the beach and a year hiatus, Bondi Feast will be back at the Pav from 18–29 July with over 40 performances and 158 artists.

The festival line-up has something for everyone, from macabre comedy opera and choose your-own-adventure theatrical walking tours to award-winning comedy and completely improvised musicals.

An update on the Bondi Pavilion Upgrade and Conservation project.

Council submitted the Stage 1 Development Application (DA) for the upgrade of our much-loved Bondi Pavilion. This relocates and expands the pottery studio, provides new and expanded public amenities, landscapes the northern courtyard, and retains the music studios. Submissions for the DA closed on 24 May and will be sent to the Heritage Commission and the Sydney Planning Panel for assessment.

Since its inception in 2002, The Nib has attracted more than 1800 entries from all over Australia and has embedded its place in the literary community.

Mark and Evette Moran have proudly supported the People's Choice Prize of The Nib for several years and Waverley Council is thrilled they are extending their support to the major prize.

Entries have now closed for this year's awards. The winners will be announced later in the year, so keep your eyes peeled for this year's literary genius.

G2 Café opens at Mill Hill Community Centre

On 19 May, the G2 café at Mill Hill was official reopened! As well as making great coffee, the café, known affectionately as the ‘hole in the wall’, has facilitated connections between local businesses, residents, seniors, clients and staff visiting the area. Waverley Council has supported Holdsworth Community to run the newly opened G2 Café as a social enterprise in partnership with Windgap. Apart from serving delicious coffee, cakes and lunches, G2 will offer a valuable transition to work program for people with intellectual disabilities. This initiative supports Waverley’s vision for a socially inclusive community.

If you are in the area make sure you drop in to the café to show your support and grab a bite!

G2 complements our Waverley Community Living Program (WCLP), which provide accommodation, independent living skills training, and support for adults with an intellectual disability.

Waverley Council Small Grants 2016/17

Each financial year Council allocates funds of up to \$100,000 for small grants for the community. In the 2016/17 financial year, we were proud to fund 29 projects, across three categories: community,

creative streets, and environmental sustainability. In Round One, 11 projects were funded to the value of \$39,100 and many of these grants provided support for significant local events such as: Flickerfest, Jewish Arts Theatre, REELise Film Festival and Tactile Tours for Sculpture by the Sea. In Round Two, we were pleased to fund 18 projects to the value of \$48,738, bringing the total to \$87,838 for the financial year.

One exciting project funded was supporting Moriah College to install two water refill stations after the student body identified that roughly 5000 plastic bottles were being sold in the canteen annually. The canteen has now stopped selling bottled water and the College have taken great steps to reduce their waste output.

Our Small Grants Program helped Moriah College fund installing two water refill stations, after the student body identified that roughly 5000 plastic bottles were being sold in the canteen annually.

It was great to see over half the submissions received in 2016/17 were from first-time applicants, which demonstrates the growing appetite for community initiatives. We want to continue to support great initiatives by our local residents, community groups, schools and businesses, so if you have an excellent idea that will benefit the community, be sure to submit your grant proposal for the next round, closing in September.

SECOND NATURE, I'M IN!



We're continuing our mission to make sustainability second nature in our local area. To do so, we're working with you – our local community and businesses – to make sustainability more than just a second thought. Every personal action counts to help achieve our goals in reducing waste, keeping our oceans clean, saving water, looking after our natural spaces and addressing climate change.

Plastic Free July

We've partnered with Blue Bondi Green, Happy Fish, Plastic Free Bronte, Responsible Runners, Seaside Scavenge, Tangaroa Blue, Take3, Transition Bondi, and Underwater Research Group, to run a program of events from a film screening and panel discussion, to plastic free skin care alternatives workshop, and a Bondi Beach clean-up.

Solar Bins

Council has installed Australia's second largest fleet of solar powered smart bins at Bondi Beach and Bondi Junction. The bins use an internal compactor powered by solar to compact the waste, whilst inbuilt sensors use Wi-Fi to communicate via text and email to staff when the bins are full.

The use of solar power smart technology mean the bins can hold up to five times the amount of waste as a normal bin, keeping the area cleaner and more attractive.

Leading the way in sustainable street lights

We're currently partnering with Ausgrid to upgrade street lights with more energy-efficient lighting.

Over the next 12 months, 760 residential street lights will be replaced with new LED lighting, this is the first time this has happened within the Ausgrid regional boundaries.

This initiative will see us saving \$52,000/year, with a whopping 200 tonnes of CO2 saved per year. This is the equivalent to taking 67 cars off the road each year!

OUR 2017 COUNCIL ELECTIONS

It's that time again! Elections will be held for Waverley Council on Saturday 9 September 2017.

To vote, your name needs to be on the electoral commission residents list, or Council's non-residential list. You have until 6pm, Monday 31 July to do so, to ensure you can vote.

Are you an owner, rate-paying lessee or occupier of rateable land which isn't your primary residence?

If so, you may be entitled to be added to the roll of non-residential owners of rateable land, or the roll of occupiers and rate-paying lessees. This enables you to vote in the Waverley Council elections. To check your eligibility, please go to votensw.info. Enrolments for this roll also close at 6pm on Monday 31 July. If a claim for non-residential employment was made for a previous council election, and you wish to claim enrolment for this election you must re-apply.

Interested in being a candidate?

If you are eligible to vote at an election for Waverley Council, then you can also stand as a candidate.

Nominations to become a candidate for election open on Monday 31 July 2017 and close at 12pm on Wednesday 9 August 2017.

COMMUNITY LANGUAGE TRANSLATIONS



Elections will be held for Waverley Council on Saturday 9 September 2017. Look out for a list of polling places, we'll publish them on our Council website closer to the date.

To vote, your name needs to be on the electoral commission residents list, or Council's non-residential list. You have until 6pm, Monday 31 July to do so, to ensure you can vote.

If you are an owner, rate-paying lessee or occupier of rateable land you may be entitled to be added to the roll of non-residential owners of rateable land, or the roll of occupiers and rate-paying lessees. This enables you to vote in the Waverley Council elections.
