Proposer Lilliane Viselle, seconder Cathy Davitt Passed unanimously	Council will determine in early 2024 when to begin the process of updating the current Significant Tree Register.  The nomination process will be open to residents, Councillors and Council Staff where you can register your nominated tree for consideration.  To ensure the integrity of the Significant Tree Register and that professional and impartial assessment is applied, Council will engage independent arboriculture and heritage consultants to undertake detailed tree assessments for each of the nominations.  The criteria for assessment are based on general principles outlined in the Burra Charter and on criteria from the Register of the National Estate. October 2020, the draft Heritage Assessment was open for public consultation and feedback.  On 8 June 2021, Council adopted the Waverley Heritage Policy which included new urban conservation areas, new landscape conservation area, 59 individually listed items as locally significant, extending existing urban conservation areas, listing trees of heritage significance and much more. It is noted that Council found that the management of Heritage Conservation Areas reduces the erosion of established character and historic/cultural significance, in comparison to individual listings.  In mid-2023, Council lodged the proposed changes to Schedule 5 of the Waverley Local Environment Plan to the NSW Department of Planning and Environment.
