	 Council's recent Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Lime, Hello and Ario Bikes to better manage and regulate share bikes in Waverley.

No Item Bondi Junction Masterplan - Urban designers Architectus will deliver the Bondi Junction Strategic Vision and Bondi Junction Master Plan IP&R Update – Council adopted the Waverley Community Strategic Plan 2025-2035 and associated documents in June 2025. Affordable Housing Win – Council recently acquired a six-unit apartment block at 49 Mitchell Street, Bondi Beach, funded from developer contributions through Council's affordable housing reserve. Upcoming Low and Mid Rise Housing Policy Information Session on 23 July from 6pm at Bondi Pavilion. Various questions were raised from attendees regarding the eBike MOU including: Under the MOU are helmets mandatory. SC advised that helmets must lock into bikes to make them useable. What are the fines if the MOU is breached SC advised fines are 3K – similar to the 'unattended property act'. 3. Q&A SH asked about Bronte Beach and noted in a report, Bronte Beach was named as one of the four dirtiest beaches in Sydney. Council officers advised that this is within Sydney Waters remit. AD was pleased that residents can make 1: 1 appointments with Council officers regarding the

- Flood Study, noting residents in Blandford Street and Palmerstone Street would appreciate this given the severe flooding issues.
- MW asked about the Curlewis St Bike Path at Bondi Beach She is aware that it affects rubbish trucks getting to bins and the general flow of traffic given the one lane. Pedestrians are also ignoring the lights / walking everywhere and in summer it will be even more problematic. She also notes that bikes are riding higher on the footpath, ride on the street, not their path. Can consultation be done with residents on Curlewis Street before works continue? **Action**: SC / Council Officers to follow this up.
