Message from the Mayor

Waverley News autumn edition

Sydney WorldPride, Flickerfest and the Volvo Ocean Lovers Festival. Art exhibitions and sell-out theatre performances at Bondi Pavilion. Play space openings and the completion of the Bondi Junction Cycleway and Streetscape Upgrade.

It's been an action-packed start to 2023 in Waverley and the excitement continues throughout the cooler months as we keep working to get things done.

Bondi Pavilion continues to thrill audiences with a diverse range of programming and the hotly anticipated openings of our restaurant tenancies Bondi Promenade and Glory Days Bondi. The Pav's Welcome Centre is also open seven days a week for Council services including parking permits and rates.

Our restoration of the Boot Factory building at Bondi Junction is nearing completion and the upgrade of the Waverley Park play space and fitness station is underway.



We continue to seek feedback on a range of initiatives including our Bondi Bounce parklet project funded by the NSW Government's Streets as Shared Spaces Program. We have installed five parklets between Bondi Junction and Bondi Beach and they will remain in place for a trial period of six months. Feedback from the community will help determine whether the parklet trial should be extended, or alternatively, if the spaces should be considered and designed as permanent landscaped spaces with seating.

We continue to raise awareness of the Uluru Statement From the Heart and build support for the Voice to Parliament referendum. The statement calls for two substantive changes: a Voice to Parliament enshrined in the Constitution and a Makarrata Commission to supervise agreement making and truth-telling about our First Nations history. We believe the statement is a path forward for justice and selfdetermination for First Nations Peoples in this country.

Waverley Council was one of the first organisations in Australia to declare a target of net zero carbon emissions by 2030 and a target of 2035 for our community, and we're making great strides in this space through our electric vehicle charging station network and other sustainability measures. Our environmental goals are informed by our commitments to the community, the Climate and Biodiversity Emergency, circular economy principles and a long-standing commitment to embed environmental sustainability in Council's policies.

We are working with schools and families to establish a network of Safe Routes for Walking to School. Active travel such as walking and cycling is now the least common way for children in Australia to travel to school and we're hoping to change that.

And we're celebrating our community's achievements through our Waverley

Local Hero Awards, Small Grants program and other initiatives.

Belgrave Street Reserve already a local favourite



Our latest park upgrade, Belgrave Street Reserve, was officially opened on a beautiful sunny day in March, with ice blocks, and coffee all round. Over 100 people came to the ribbon cutting by Councillor Tim Murray, and Member for Coogee Dr Marjorie O'Neill.

The new equipment is natural timber, designed for creative play, with plenty of grass to run on. The park is extended with the fence pushed out and importantly has two safety gates, which means carers can enjoy letting kids run around. A big thank you to the many community members who we spoke to during our consultation, and to all who contributed ideas. The Open Space Planning team was grateful for the input into the design process and the outcome is aesthetically pleasing, and most importantly it's fun!

Belgrave Street Reserve is already popular as a stop on the walk to or from school, and families are using the play spaces every day.

Over 7,000 cyclists voting with their wheels every week

We are delighted to announce that we have completed the final section of the Bondi Junction Cycleway. Waverley Mayor Paula Masselos officiated at the festive ribbon-cutting ceremony on a gorgeous March morning with happy residents and cyclists in attendance.

As the Mayor noted in her speech, "this project allows people of all ages and abilities, including families, to hop on a bike and travel safely to their chosen destination."

There is no doubt there was pent up demand for the cycleway with numbers of bikes on the path going up every week, averaging 7,500 last month.

The Bondi Junction Cycleway and Streetscape Upgrade is part of the priority greening and beautifying project from Complete Streets which focuses on making our urban environment more appealing, more cyclist and pedestrian friendly, and prioritises easier access to public transport. The anticipated



reduction in car usage also moves us closer to Waverley Council's target of Net Zero emissions by 2035. Tick, tick, and tick!

The project includes fifty new trees, installation of street furniture and garden beds, replacement of roads and footpaths and a new separated two-way cycleway.

Just ask the members of the Hewlett Street community garden in Bronte.

Not only does their garden produce useable fruits and vegetables all yearround, at their annual Christmas get together they enjoyed refreshments prepared with ingredients, sourced from the garden.

The popular walk from Bondi Junction to Bondi Beach has just become a lot more inviting. We've installed five temporary parklets to enjoy as you wind your way through the streets to our iconic beach.

Created in alignment with Sydney World Pride celebrations, the parklets are colourful sitting areas which provide al fresco places for a chat, as well as rest and recovery along this busy walking route. The parklets are perfect touchdowns for visitors and residents, particularly elderly members of the community or children who need a break on their walk.

Easily identifiable by their gorgeous rainbow colour scheme and design, you can "bounce" from one parklet to the next by following the coloured dots on the footpath. Currently installed for a six-month trial period, we would love to know if you've used these urban 'mini parks' and if they've hit the spot. We are collecting feedback to determine the future of the parklets and whether the trial should be extended, or alternatively, made permanent.

Going Electric in Waverley

To enhance outcomes for our densely populated community, Council actively encourages sustainable housing design and development to make our homes better – to live in. for the environment and for future generations. Recently, several new sustainability provisions were included in the Waverley **Development Control Plan to support** a transition to all-electric appliances and vehicles, which can be powered by renewable energy. This will help ensure safer and healthier suburbs by reducing the pollutants and particulates from burning fossil fuels and helps address climate change by reducing greenhouse emissions.

It means new developments include Electric Vehicle charging and provide dedicated circuits and cabling to manage future charging demand, as more people switch to electric transport. Council is also providing on street EV chargers, including in Grafton Street and Castlefield Street, with more coming soon.

Council is working with experts to provide resources and information to help residents Go Electric. At an Electric Homes Info night at the Pav in March, lots of locals turned out to hear Chris



Barnes from Choice Magazine outline available technologies and see Mark La Brooy from Three Blue Ducks quickly whip up a delicious meal on an efficient induction cooktop.

Being Nature Positive

Council's ability to manage trees in public and private spaces is critical to ensuring sustainable, liveable, and resilient neighbourhoods, because our urban vegetation provides shade and shelter, improves air quality, absorbs carbon and rainfall, cools local environments, and supports our local wildlife.

With support from the NSW Government's Greener Neighbourhoods Program, Council is developing a strategy to enhance our greenspaces with suitable shrubs and trees and make our community Nature Positive – which is a term used to describe where nature is being repaired and is regenerating rather than being in decline. This strategy aligns to Council's tree management, development guidance, community engagement and compliance programs and will provide targets and accountability for protecting and growing our urban vegetation.

If you would like to green up around your dwelling you can request a street tree by emailing treemgt@waverley.nsw.gov.au or you can join our Living Connections program and receive free native seedlings and guidance to turn your garden into a haven for some birds and pollinators. Swap and Wash – reusable takeaway container trial

Enjoy takeaway without the waste

In partnership with the NSW EPA and rePlated, Waverley Council is supporting seven Bondi food outlets to trial reusable takeaway containers, through a 'Swap and Wash' system.

The aim of this trial is to help reduce waste and litter from single-use takeaway packaging which remains a key litter item across our beaches. To get involved customers simply purchase a rePlated Mealbox at one of the participating retailers when they order a takeaway meal. It's all part of how we're making waste avoidance second nature at Waverley Council.

This project is a NSW Environment Protection Agency, Waste Less Recycle More initiative funded by the waste levy.

key guests; Indigenous lawyer, Eddie Synot, who has worked on the Uluru dialogue since 2018, Assistant Minister for Trade and Manufacturing, Senator Tim Ayres, and Member for Wentworth, Allegra Spender. The free workshops will help build a deeper understanding of the Voice to Parliament and create confidence in community members to discuss their knowledge with others.
