

Advance bookings open for new pavilion



The new Waverley Park Pavilion is due to open in the coming months. Council is seeking applications for advanced bookings from the community, including clubs and organisations who want to hire the new facilities on a one-off or longer-term basis, such as the sports court, community room and club room.

Applications will be accepted from 12 March until 2 April. Further bookings will be taken throughout the year, subject to availability.

Hourly, half day and full day rates are available Monday – Sunday for the sports court and community room.

Rooms for hire...

INDOOR SPORTS COURT

Spectator seating has capacity for 50 people. The sports court will primarily cater for a wide range of sports and recreation activities with line markings in place for basketball, netball, futsal (indoor football) and volleyball. The sports hall will also cater for limited larger civic and recreational functions (eg. school presentations, awards ceremonies).

COMMUNITY ROOM

The room seats a maximum of 120 people. The community room is available for groups for low impact classes (eg. yoga, tai chi and some forms of dance), meetings, conferences and training and for civic and recreational functions (eg. presentations, fund raising, AGM). There is an adjacent kitchen facility which is available for hire.

CLUB ROOM

The room seats a maximum of 40 people. The club room will be predominately used by the sporting clubs in the evenings and weekends as part of their agreed licensees. The northern club room will be available to book in the summer for small meetings and classes.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Since joining Council I have been well aware of residents calling for improvements in road and pedestrian safety, and the need for us to reduce our eco footprint and save taxpayers money.

I am pleased to announce that on becoming Mayor I have been able to initiate a number of projects to improve safety for road users and to reduce Council's greenhouse emissions.

On the issue of safety there will be up to 10 new pedestrian crossings across the Municipality and we are now proposing to establish 40km per hour safe traffic zones at Bronte Beach, Tamarama Marine Drive, and within Bondi Junction.

If NSW Transport agrees to the 40km zone they will also fund 50% of the cost of installing the traffic calming devices, saving ratepayers up to half a million dollars.

Another initiative is the proposed relocation of the cycleway from Oxford Street Mall to a newly constructed separated cycleway on Spring Street. The current situation, where the designated bike path traverses the Mall, is dangerous, especially to older people, and cannot continue.

With respect to our eco footprint Council recently signed off on the 10% Challenge, which compliments our existing commitment to energy and water saving improvements which will, not only improve the environment but, save ratepayers around \$147,000 per year, reduce electricity usage annually by 850,000 kilowatt hours, reduce Council's greenhouse emissions each year by 889 tonnes, and give us a yearly water saving of over 1500 kilolitres.

These are two sets of important initiatives which will make Waverley an even more enjoyable and desirable place to live and work.

Waverley's local heroes recognised

Mayor Wakefield announced the winners of the 2012 Waverley Local Hero Awards at Council's Australia Day ceremony earlier this year.

Graham Ford received the 2012 Local Hero Award for his ongoing commitment to the surf life-saving community Australia-wide, and to the Waverley community in particular.

This year there were two highly commended recipients. John Wright, a well known figure in the Waverley community, has volunteered his time for various organisations in the area, including as an active Justice of the Peace since 1955.

Peter McCallum received recognition for his contributions in a volunteer and professional capacity,



including providing tuition to Bronte Public School students since his retirement in 1999, after 17 years as principal of the school.

A new youth category was introduced to the awards and the achievements of Young Local Heroes Jenni Iloski and Zac Cherry were celebrated at the ceremony.

Call for volunteers

Help a young person reach their goal

Bondi Youth Accommodation (BYA) is a specialist homeless youth service. It provides safe and secure accommodation and case management, to support youth to improve their own lives.

Green Light Movement, a pilot project of Bondi Youth Accommodation, is a reduced fee, learn-to-drive program providing supervised driver training for young people who have experienced homelessness and do not have parent support to learn how to drive.

The idea came from former BYA client, Jenni – who together with BYA Coordinator Rebecca Mullins – set up the pilot program, gaining support from Mazda Foundation, Matana Foundation, Department of Juvenile Justice, Caltex (Bondi, Coogee, Rosebay, Kingsford, Randwick), Bendigo Bank (Clovelly), Waverley Council, Randwick Council, Souths Juniors and Sydney Credit Union.

In NSW a young learner driver must complete 120 hours of supervised driving before being able to sit for their provisional driver's licence. Most young people learn to drive with parents and family members.

However, for young people, who are unable to live at home (without

family support), learning to drive is a challenge – if not impossible.

Green Light Movement provides 10 hours with a professional driving instructor, spread out over the required 120 hours of 'on road' supervision. Each young person is also linked with a volunteer 'supervising driver', to supervise the remaining hours.

Volunteer 'supervising drivers' are key to giving young people the opportunity to learn to drive. Two hours a week will support a young person to reach their goal.

Green Light will provide the car, interactive workshops and ongoing support. To volunteer all you need is a manual driver's licence.

Early Education Centre on track to open in July

Waverley Mayor John Wakefield attended a site inspection for the new Mill Hill Early Education Centre in February with Council officers.



Work is progressing with nearly 80 per cent of the construction complete. "The next stage will see the commencement of internal fitout and landscaping works," said Mayor Wakefield.

Council received \$1.65 million under the Federal Government's Additional Early Learning and Care Centre Funding Package for the project with a budget for demolition and construction of \$4.177 million. The centre has been designed by architects Baker Kavanagh Pty Ltd.

The new centre will provide family and children's support services such as a baby health centre and parent education groups. An official opening will take place in July.

Grow it Local in Waverley

Council has thrown its support behind a new initiative, Grow it Local, celebrating locals who make the most of their little patch – be it a pot on the balcony, a square of dirt in the backyard or a community garden – and do their bit to reduce food miles and greenhouse emissions.

The project is a great fit for Waverley Council's Environmental Action Plan target to achieve reductions of the community's greenhouse gas emissions by 30% in 2020 based on 2003/04 levels. The same plan recognises the importance of getting behind projects that celebrate positive environmental behaviours and sustainability.

Grow it Local invites anyone in the LGA growing their own food, on any scale, to register their little (or big) patch online and share photos and gardening tips on Facebook. The first 30 participants to register can then come along to Bondi Markets on Saturday 31 March with their Grow it Local bag filled with their home-grown produce to have it cooked by local chef Grant LaBrooy from Three Blue Ducks at a community lunch.

Plastic shopping bags – do you recycle yours?

Did you know Australians still use over 3.9 billion plastic checkout bags a year. That's 10 million a day!

But only 3% of those plastic bags are being recycled, despite recycling facilities being available at major supermarkets and retail outlets.

Used plastic checkout bags can be taken to participating supermarkets for recycling. The bags are collected in bulk then compacted into large blocks ready for further processing and conversion into raw material to make recycled plastic products.

Remember! Please keep plastic bags out of your home recycling bin, as they can cause big problems when placed in your kerbside recycling bin.

That's over 200 tonnes of food waste recycled every year in eastern suburbs backyards.



LED streetlighting trial in North Bondi

Waverley Council is working with AusGrid in a trial of light emitting diode (LED) streetlights in Ramsgate Ave East in North Bondi. Streetlighting is a major contributor to Council's greenhouse gas emissions. LED technology has the potential to save up to 75% in energy consumption compared to current lighting technology and has been identified as one way for Council to reduce its emissions footprint.

The LED streetlights just installed require only 28 watts of power and will be able to replace mercury vapour streetlights that draw 96 watts of power. The trial will assist Council in evaluating this technology in Australian conditions, such as the constant salt spray at Bondi.



In 1920 Beach Court was built on the corner of Ramsgate Avenue and the Bondi Beach promenade at North Bondi. With its beautiful location right on the beach, this complex of flats, refreshment rooms and a dance hall became a popular local venue.

Tiny's Dance Hall opened in Beach Court soon after the building was completed and initially it had quite a respectable reputation. Beach Court's reputation started to slide in 1932, with new owners Alexander Ernest Anderson, notorious criminal dentist Freddie Goldsmith and the 'flamboyant' medical practitioner Dr Reginald Stuart-Jones.

During the 1930s Stuart-Jones was involved in numerous illicit businesses, including illegal gambling (particularly horse race 'fixing'), sly grog and drug dealing – partnered in these various activities by Sydney's most infamous criminals. He was known as 'the Doc' and many were grateful for his discreet treatment following gun battles. One of Stuart-Jones' companies was ominously named Terminal Investments.

In late 1932 Freddie Goldsmith, on behalf of Alexander Ernest Anderson advised that he had changed the name of Beach Court to 'The Lido' and (unsuccessfully) applied to Council to build dressing cubicles on the property.

They turned the Dance Hall into a nightclub and at The Lido patrons could expect after-hours alcohol, drugs and access to prostitutes. Later, during World War II, it became a popular place for visiting American servicemen to let their hair down.

In the early hours one morning in December 1932, The Lido was raided and 37 people were arrested including the manager, Leo Mandrell, who was charged with selling alcohol without a licence. The raids continued and so did the late night revelry, with the club advertising 'special decorations, cabaret and an a-la-carte menu' at its all-night New Year's Eve party to welcome in 1934.

The premises became so notorious that surf life saving clubs banned their members from going to The Lido in their club blazers, believing it brought the surf clubs into disrepute.

By the late 1930s Beach Court was coming to the attention of Waverley Council, who began agitating for the owners to exercise more control over their customers. If they didn't do this, the Council warned, they would close The Lido.

The nightclub continued until the mid-1940s, briefly known by other names such as The Mirrors and The Palms.


Beach Court survived its racy period. In later years it was better known for its community meeting rooms and beachside kiosk, Tiny's Café, which provided food to hungry beach goers at the northern end of Bondi Beach.

In 1957 the community meeting rooms were hired by a group to discuss the formation of a rugby league club for the eastern suburbs. The club was formed and the Eastern Suburbs Rugby League Club began operating from Thursday to Sunday at Beach Court, moving to the first floor of the Bondi Pavilion the following year.

It was also the first home of the Bondi Boys' Club which itself also later moved to the Bondi Pavilion.

Waverley Council bought Beach Court in 1958/59, it was demolished in 1966 and the site is now occupied by the North Bondi park Biddigal Reserve.
