If your garden is approved, Council will work with you to create a Plan of Management which will outline expectations and compliance requirements. The plan also ensures the preservation of the shared amenity for other users of the space.

Council will undertake regular inspections of approved gardens to monitor compliance. If a garden is considered noncompliant, Council may issue instructions to restore the garden to a satisfactory standard within 28 days.

Gardens on public land may be susceptible to vandalism, theft, and other damage. Although Council is committed to supporting the public gardening program, residents are responsible for any costs and works associated with restoring gardens following any such damage. Residents are not entitled to financial compensation for any such damage.
