



Next steps for Bondi Junction's future

Council has received extensive community feedback on the draft Bondi Junction Master Plan, with thousands engaging with the exhibition and hundreds providing submissions. All feedback is now being reviewed and will be used to inform any changes to the draft plan.

An Engagement Outcomes Report will be prepared for Council, with a decision on the final Master Plan expected at the July Council meeting. If adopted by Councillors, the Master Plan will become the guiding framework for Bondi Junction, shaping future planning decisions, investment priorities, and how development applications are assessed.

The next stage will be a rezoning process, where Council prepares a planning proposal to translate the Master Plan into updated planning controls. This process includes further community consultation and State Government review.

Big improvements coming to Waverley

In line with our commitment to investing in Waverley's future, we've budgeted a record \$52.9 million in the largest capital works program ever seen, including \$12.5 million to upgrade and maintain our roads, as well as \$11.6 million to renew our vital parks and recreational spaces.

In 2026-27, residents can expect:

- Major upgrades at the North Bondi shops and Bus Terminus
- Completion of the major redevelopment of Bronte SLSC
- Refurbishment of Waverley's affordable housing stock
- Construction to begin on the Bondi Park Half Court
- Rebuilding of the Bronte Beach Pump House and installation of new pump infrastructure
- New safety structures and pedestrian crossings at the Murrivierie, Mitchell and Hardy Street intersection
- Demolition of the old Council Chambers to make way for an exciting new community and recreation facility

Parking around Waverley is getting EasyAs!

As of 2 July, parking permits have become digital for all residents and visitors to Waverley. This major system update allows you to apply for and manage parking permits online, making the process simpler, faster and more convenient.

The update also means that your vehicle registration plate serves as your permit, so there is no longer a need for stickers on your car's windshield.
